Consumer demand in Portugal is mainly for olive oil and groundnut oil; consequently domestic demand for other vegetable oils and for oilseeds for manufacturing them is fairly small.

It is nevertheless true that under Portugal's legislation, for reasons of public health, oils intended for use as food must be approved by the authorities, which decide whether or not their characteristics meet the legal requirements. The measure is designed in particular to avoid mixtures and fraud with respect to olive oil, in order to maintain purity and high quality.

This health restriction has recently been relaxed to a great extent, and the long list of oils authorized for direct consumption now includes in particular oil. of olives, groundnuts, olive residues, acorns, grape pips, cottonseed, safflower seed, tomato seed, sunflower seed, and maize. In addition to these oils, the use of coconut oil, palm oil, palm-kernel oil and soya oil is permitted in the manufacture of margarine.

The number of permitted oils has been increased in recent years to take account of the requirements of industry and trade. Authorization is granted on a case-bycase basis.

The import prohibition on foodstuffs containing saccharine dates from a longstanding measure which was revised by Legislative Decree No. 47.531 of 9 February 1967; this Legislative Decree prohibits the inclusion of saccharine in foodstuffs. This prohibition is justified by the toxic effects which can result from continuing consumption of this product and is therefore consistent with the provisions of Article XX(b) of the General Agreement.

The fact that the Portuguese health authorities allow saccharine in powder or tablet form to be imported under licence does not appear contrary to the regulations concerning inclusion of this product in foodstuffs. The differentiation can be accounted for by the fact that pure saccharine, sold exclusively by dispensing chemists, is a product intended for therapeutic use and is sold under supervision. On the other hand, its inclusion in foodstuffs could adversely affect public health, because in this case it is difficult for the health authorities to exercise supervision.
