COMMUNICATION FROM SWEDEN

**Revised Conditional Offer by Sweden Concerning
Initial Commitments on Trade in Services**

Revision

The following communication is circulated at the request of Sweden to the members of the Group of Negotiations on Services.

General conditions

1. This revised conditional offer presented by Sweden is based on the draft texts for a General Agreement on Trade in Services (GATS), as contained in the Draft Final Act of 20 December 1991, and takes into account developments in the services negotiations since the latest submission of Sweden's conditional offer (document MTN.TNC/W/59/Rev.1 dated 19 February 1992). Sweden reserves the right to review its draft schedule in the light of the complete GATS-package before submitting a final national schedule.
2. Sweden's commitments remain conditional upon the final outcome of the negotiations on the Agreement, in particular an effective application of the MFN-obligation in Article II of the Agreement. Sweden reserves the right to revise and modify its offer in the light of the content of the rules and disciplines in the Agreement, developments in the negotiating process as well as to make technical changes to this offer, correct possible errors, omissions or inaccuracies.
3. Sweden reserves the right to revise its offer in relation to the sectoral coverage, the scope and the assessed trade value of commitments offered by other participants, including any MFN-exemptions sought, before presenting a draft schedule on initial commitments. Sweden expects that its negotiating partners will, in common with its own approach, be prepared to undertake commitments which represent a step towards liberalization and exclude in any case any potential deliberalization.
4. In the area of movement of personnel, no offer is made to bind regulations constituting Swedish immigration law. However, Sweden offers to bind regulations governing the extension of work permits for certain categories of personnel that are considered essential for a service supplier to be able to enter a market or operate on it. The present offer is made on the condition and understanding that the provisions of the Nordic Labour Market fall outside the scope of the Agreement.

5. The commitments are based on the Secretariat's note to all participants "Scheduling of Initial Commitments in Trade in Services: Explanatory Note" (document MTN.GNS/W/164 dated 3 September 1993). According to this scheduling manual (paragraph 10), there is no obligation in the GATS which requires a Member to take measures outside its territorial jurisdiction.

Subsequently, Sweden's commitments are made on the assumption that subsidies are not to be listed in case of cross-border supply or consumption abroad.

6. The method used for sectoral classification is based on the document MTN.GNS/W/120, with some limited variations. In addition reference has, as far as possible, been made to the UN Provisional Central Product Classification (Statistical Papers Series M No. 77).

7. It should be noted that regarding the offer on telecommunication services, Sweden reserves its right to review the commitments in the light of the prolonged negotiations. Sweden also reserves its right to modify the offer on audiovisual services to be able to take into account the overall result in the sector.

A limited liability company (joint stock company) may be established by one or several founders. A founding party shall either be a resident in Sweden or a Swedish legal entity. A partnership can only be a founding party if each partner is a resident in Sweden.**) Requirement that limited liability companies must be audited by at least one qualified auditor (see "Accounting services"). Corresponding conditions to the above mentioned prevail for the establishment of other types of legal entities than limited liability companies.

The managing director and at least 50% of the members of the board must be residents in Sweden.**)

Senior employee of a services supplier who primarily directs the organization, receiving general supervision or direction principally from the board of directors or shareholders of the business. The work may include directing the service supplier or a department or sub-division thereof, supervising or controlling the work of other supervisory, professional or managerial employees or having the authority to hire or fire or recommend such or other personnel actions.

"specialist":

Person employed by a service supplier who possesses advanced or special a) qualifications referring to a type of work or trade requiring specific technical knowledge or b) knowledge essential or proprietary to the service supplier's services, research equipment, techniques or management.

"business visitors":

a) Person not based within Swedish territory, and not receiving any remuneration from a source located within Sweden, who is a representative of a service supplier and who is seeking temporary entry for the purpose of negotiating for the sale of services or entering into agreements to sell services for that service supplier, where that representative will not be engaged in making direct sales to the general public or in supplying services himself.

ATTACHMENT CONCERNING MARITIME SERVICES

1. International Shipping, 3.b):

Commercial presence of any form (office, branch, subsidiary) for the purpose of selling or marketing locally the services supplied by the international maritime transport services provider, and undertaking such activities which are necessary to this end.

2. Maritime Cargo Handling Services:

Activities exercised by stevedore companies, including terminal operators, but not including the direct activities of dockers, when this workforce is organised independently of the stevedoring or terminal operator companies. The activities covered include the organisation and supervision of:

- the loading/discharging of cargo to/from a ship
- the lashing/unlashing of cargo,
- the reception/delivery and safekeeping of cargoes before shipment or after discharge.

3. Customs Clearance Services:

Activities consisting in carrying out on behalf of another party customs formalities concerning import, export or through transport of cargoes, whether this service is the main activity of the service provider or a usual complement of its main activity.

4. Container Station and Depot Services:

Activities consisting in storing containers, whether in port areas or inland, with a view to their stuffing/stripping, repairing and making them available for shipments.

5. Maritime Agency Services:

Activities consisting in representing, within a given geographical area, as an agent, the business interests of one or more shipping lines or shipping companies, for the following purposes:

- marketing and sales of maritime transport and related services, from quotation to invoicing, and issuance of bills of lading on behalf of the companies; acquisition and resale of the necessary related services, preparation of documentation, and provision of business information;
- acting on behalf of the companies organising the call of the ship or taking over cargoes when required.
