COMMUNICATION FROM THE DOMINICAN REPUBLIC

Conditional Offer of the Dominican Republic Concerning
Initial Commitments on Trade in Services

The following communication is circulated at the request of the Dominican Republic to the members of the Group of Negotiations on Services.

I. General considerations

- 1. This document concerns the conditional offer of commitments which the Government of the Dominican Republic proposes to enter into in the framework of the General Agreement on Trade in Services (GATS). This offer seeks to make a substantive contribution to the negotiations aimed at establishing multilateral disciplines and liberalizing trade in services as a means of promoting development, and particularly that of developing countries.
- 2. This offer covers exclusively the sectors mentioned in Section III on specific commitments. The horizontal measures specified in Section II refer only to the sectors and sub-sectors mentioned there. The sectoral breakdown is based on the classification in document MTN.GNS/W/120 and the United Nations CPC List.
- 3. Where relevant, the international conventions, agreements and treaties signed by and in force in the Dominican Republic relating to trade and services referred to in this offer shall prevail.
- 4. This offer does not imply any binding of laws, regulations, decrees, decisions, orders and resolutions in force with respect to tax, foreign-exchange, monetary, financial, labour, immigration, government-procurement, environmental-protection and natural-resource-conservation matters, among others.
- 5. This offer is conditional upon the overall results obtained in the Uruguay Round and in particular the degree of attention and level of commitments received by the service sectors and sub-sectors which are of priority interest to the Dominican Republic for attaining its socio-economic development objectives.
- 6. The Dominican Republic reserves the right to maintain, modify or reduce this offer at any time prior to the entry into force of the multilateral agreement, in conformity with the conditions established above.

II. Horizontal commitments applicable to the sectors mentioned in the sectoral part of the list

The horizontal measures applicable to market access and national treatment in services sectors in the Dominican Republic are described below:

1. Conditions and limitations applied to market access (Article XVI of GATS)

<u>Consumption abroad</u>: Consumption of services abroad by residents of the Dominican Republic is governed by the foreign-exchange provisions in force in the country.

<u>Commercial presence</u>: For a company constituted under foreign law to be able to engage in commerce in the Dominican Republic, it must comply with the requirements and procedures laid down in the Commerce Code and other laws and regulations governing commercial activities in the country.

Foreign investment must be authorized by the Directorate of Foreign Investment, and subsequently registered in the Central Bank register of foreign investment and technology transfer contracts.

The annual profits generated by foreign capital that has been duly registered with the Central Bank may be remitted abroad up to an amount equivalent to 25 per cent of the registered capital.

Registration of foreign investment is restricted by the following provisions:

- (a) Totally prohibited in public services, such as drinking water, sewage and postal services and any other area the Directorate declares closed to foreign investment;
- (b) Limited to a percentage not exceeding 29 per cent of the equity in:
 - production of material and equipment directly related to the national defence and security;
 - advertising, broadcasting, newspapers, magazines, publishing and mass communication media;
 - internal land transport, except where directly related to import and export, internal air transport, maritime transport, cabotage and international maritime transport;
 - forestry;
- (c) Limited to a percentage not exceeding 49 per cent of the equity in:
 - crop, livestock and poultry farming
 - fishery;
 - insurance.

In other areas the registration of capital investment may be authorized without percentage limits, except that foreign investment for the purchase of property for speculative purposes may not be registered. This does not concern the purchase of real estate for the purpose of carrying out tourism projects.

All foreign companies must recruit a minimum of 80 per cent of Dominican employees. In special circumstances, the employment of more foreigners may be authorized when it is hard or impossible to replace them by Dominicans, with the obligation for the company to train Dominican staff.

Movement of suppliers: The provision of services by suppliers not resident in the Dominican Republic is limited to the senior and specialized staff associated with commercial presence, and must contribute to the training of Dominican personnel in the areas of specialization concerned. Market access for foreign physical persons is subject to the requirement of a work permit and work visa.

The provision in the Dominican Republic, through the presence of physical persons, of professional services such as legal, accounting, consultancy, engineering, architectural and medical services, is subject to the fulfilment of the requirements laid down in the laws governing the exercise of such professions. Authorization to engage in the professions mentioned above is not granted to nationals of countries which do not accord similar rights to Dominican professional persons.

2. Conditions and limitations applicable to national treatment (Article XVII of GATS)

Under the Tax Code, income received by foreigners in the form of payment of dividends, royalties and interest is subject to payment of the taxes provided for by law.

The laws relating to labour are territorial, and apply to Dominicans and foreigners without distinction, except as otherwise provided for in international agreements. The law recognizes as basic rights of workers, inter alia, freedom of association, vocational training and respect for physical integrity, privacy and personal dignity.
