COMMUNICATION FROM PERU

Revised MFN Exemption List of Peru

The following communication is circulated at the request of Peru to the members of the Group of Negotiations on Services.

Peru reserves the right to revise and modify this list in the light of the final results of the text of the Framework Agreement, the composition and scope of the initial commitments entered into and the exemptions from most-favoured-nation treatment requested by other participants. Thus, Peru reserves the right not to apply the most-favoured-nation clause to those countries and in those sectors or sub-sectors where it is not applied automatically and unconditionally to Peru, as provided for in Article II of the GATS. Peru also reserves the right to make technical changes in the list at any time.
