GOVERNMENT PROCUREMENT STATISTICS FOR CALENDAR YEAR 1981

Note by the Secretariat

At its meetings held on 23 February and 25 May 1983, the Committee carried out a review of statistics which Parties had submitted in accordance with Article VI:9 of the Agreement and requested the secretariat to circulate an overall summary of the figures supplied which covered calendar year 1981, which was the first year of operation of the Agreement. This summary is attached.

As already stated (L/5503, paragraph 17), the Committee considers that the data exchange exercise has been very useful. It has nevertheless not considered it appropriate to draw substantive conclusions from data available to it so far.

The value of some contracts which in Austria, Finland, Singapore and Switzerland were shared between two or more supplying countries have for the purpose of this table been been divided equally between these sources.
