LIST OF INTERNATIONAL STANDARDIZING BODIES FOR PURPOSES OF ARTICLES 10.4 AND 13.3 CF THE AGREEMENT

Note by the Secretariat

Article 10.4 of the Agreement states: "The GATT secretariat will, when it receives notifications in accordance with the provisions of this Agreement, circulate copies of the notifications to all Parties and interested international standardizing and certification bodies ...".

Article 13.3 of the Agreement states: "It is understood that unnecessary duplication should be avoided between the work under this Agreement and that of governments in other technical bodies, e.g. the Joint FAO/WHO Codex Alimentarius Commission. The Committee shall examine this problem with a view to minimizing such duplication.".

At the second meeting of the Committee, on 24 April 1980, it was agreed that the secretariat would circulate a list of the main bodies that may be concerned under Article 10.4 and that such a list should also enable the Committee to identify possible areas of duplication. The international standardizing bodies listed in the present note are such as defined in Annex 1 to the Agreement on Technical Barriers to Trade, i.e., an international standardizing body is a governmental or non-governmental body, one of whose recognized activities is in the field of standardization and whose membership is open to the relevant bodies of at least all Parties to the Agreement. The membership, the main periodical publications and a brief account of main fields of activity are given for each body in the list. The list only covers bodies dealing with product-related standards whose activities are relevant to the purposes of the Agreement. It is not exhaustive and is subject to change in the light of further information that may become available to the secretariat.
