INITIATIVE OFFERS BY NEW ZEALAND IN RESPONSE TO REQUESTS SUBMITTED TO HER
MAJESTY BY CERTAIN COUNTRIES FOR TARIFF CONCESSIONS.

It is to be understood that these offers are made without commitment and on the assumption that satisfactory offers will be received in return. In certain cases New Zealand tariff rates have been reduced at the expense of countries which previously received preferential treatment. In these cases it is also understood that the reductions proposed to be made by New Zealand are subject to satisfactory agreement respecting reciprocal concessions to such countries.

Where an offer is made to bind or reduce an existing rate (other than a British Preferential Rate) which is subject to surtax, it is the intention that the rate offered shall not be subject to surtax. If, in any such case, the goods are liable only to primeage duty (3 per cent ad. valorem) under the British Preferential Tariff, it is the intention to exempt those goods from such primeage duty. Where goods are at present liable free of duty (except primeage) under the General Tariff and there is an offer to bind such free entry the primeage duty will continue to be payable as long as similar goods admissible under the British Preferential Tariff are also subject to primeage.

ad T.No. 37 a) 1. The period of three months prior to importation within which apples have to be picked in order to be eligible for the application of the conventional rate of 75 Kčs per 100 kg dates back from the day of Customs clearance in Czechoslovakia. The consignments of apples are to be accompanied by a certificate indicating the time of picking. The Government of the exporting country will agree with the Czechoslovak Government upon a list of names of authorities of the exporting country which will be charged with issuing the certificates.

ad T.No. 202 It is agreed that the term "hemp" also covers New Zealand flax (*Phormium tenax*).
