

MERCHANDISE TRADE VOLUME

UPDATED ON 5 APRIL 2023



World merchandise trade volume¹ decreased by 2.4% in the fourth quarter of 2022 over the previous quarter, in seasonally adjusted terms.

World merchandise exports decreased by 2.6% in Q4 2022. Asia saw the largest decrease (-4.8%) while South & Central America reported the only positive growth of exports (0.5%) in the fourth quarter 2022. On the import side, world merchandise imports decreased by 2.2% in Q4 2022.



MERCHANDISE TRADE PRICES

Prices for non-fuel commodities decreased by 0.7% in Q4 2022. Prices for fuels decreased 26.2% while manufactures became 1.5% less expensive as compared to the previous quarter. Quarter-on-quarter growth, %
