






#### UNCTAD led UN Inter-Agency Cluster

#### **Country Projects funded by SECO**









- The SECO project in Tanzania aimed at "opening the tourism sector opportunities for food products and skills". It created the conditions for optimized business linkages between large and local suppliers along identified global value-chains for increased market access (national, regional and international.)
- Business linkages increased the competitiveness of Tanzania as it helped to capture the opportunities for increased trade and investment brought about by globalisation and economic liberalization.
- The SECO project in Tanzania offered a comprehensive approach to the promotion of sustainable business linkages with a combination of advisory (policy-oriented) and technical assistance (action-oriented) services in the field of enterprise development and foreign direct investment (FDI).



#### **Key results** Productive Capacity and Exports

**UNCTAD** supported more than 800 farmers (dairy, passion fruit and tomato) with tailored entrepreneurship training; UNCTAD "Empretec Programme" and "Farming as a Business trainees" reported **an increase in their business turnover** on average 78 per cent in 2018 compared to 2017.

UNCTAD and ITC supported farm level training while UNIDO worked with processors on ISO certification and, packaging and business linkages along the same value chain which led to boost in exports regionally and beyond.


Darsh Industries have signed supply contracts with 19 supermarkets and 12 hotels; ISO certification for processors catalyst that **led to exports to Kenya of tomato paste** and further overseas contracts; Natureripe Kilimajaro Limited **exporting dried fruits to Oman**.



#### **Key results** Investment Promotion

With the original support of UNCTAD, the **Tanzania Investment Centre (TIC) website** now provides for activity-by-activity step-by-step guidance in investing into the tourism sector. The service reports an average of 2,100 visitors a month.









#### **Key message: Impact through Partnerships**

Partnership at the Country level: Delivering as One








### **Key message: Appropriate Donor support**
