SPS measures Annex A, SPS Agreement



Measures taken to protect heath and life of:

From risks arising from:





- Additives, contaminants toxins or disease-causing organisms in foods, beverages and feedstuffs
- Diseases carried by animals or plants, and entry, establishment or spread of pests



Animals

- Additives, contaminants toxins or disease-causing organisms in foods, beverages and feedstuffs
- Plant or animal carried diseases (zoonoses)
- Pests, diseases or disease-causing organisms



Plants

• Pests, diseases or disease causing organisms



Territory

 Damages caused by the entry, establishment, or spread of pests Annex A, footnote 4: Contaminants include pesticide and veterinary drug residues as well as extraneous matter.

Including national systems for:

Approving the use of additives

Establishing tolerances for contaminants in foods, beverages or feedstuffs

Key provisions relevant to pesticide MRLs



- No undue delay
- Publishing of standard processing period
- Non-discrimination
- System for the establishment of tolerances for contaminants: consider using international standards as the basis for access until final determination is made








MRL-related Notifications



As of 2 March 2022





Conformity with Codex standards?


MRL notifications – Regular
