



# Leveraging the APEC Import MRL Guidelines for Trade Facilitation in ASEAN

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- Recognition of differing pesticide use among economies
- Science-based, internationally-accepted risk assessment methodologies
- Minimization of data requirements
- Protection of public health and safety, while facilitating trade
- Emphasis on use of Codex MRLs, including supporting JMPR monographs, where such MRLs exist

How to do this in a practical way?

Don't reinvent the wheel!





## **ASEAN import MRL Pilot Project**

- Apply the APEC Import MRL Guidelines using real case and real data
- Gain experience in <u>reviewing</u> import MRL submissions (to establish ASEAN MRLs) under different scenarios
- Gain experience in <u>submitting</u> import MRL applications of ASEAN interest to APEC partners (to establish import MRLs)
- Share lessons learned and areas for improvement with APEC community (and beyond if interested)





#### A Pilot for ASEAN Members

#### Concept for Pilot:

- 1. Develop a pilot mechanism for the EWG to receive, process, and evaluate import MRL applications
- 2. Develop criteria ("tests") for potential applications to be submitted to ASEAN EWG
- 3. Develop a process to prioritize/limit potential applications in the future
- 4. Receive a few (e.g. 3-5 applications) import MRL applications, submitted by APEC economies
- 5. ASEAN members (e.g. 3-5 applications) submit to partnering APEC economies for consideration to establish import MRLs
- 6. Based on experience of pilot, consider how to improve process and to continue initiatives on import MRLs







## **Next Steps**

- **1**. Selection and proposal of pesticide/commodity combinations for the import MRL pilot to importing economy for acceptance
- From ASEAN to partner economy
- From partner economy to ASEAN

- **2**. Pre-submission consultation with importing economy authority
- Scope, requirements
- Timeline

**3**. Prepare and submit the dossier using APEC iMRL application form - <u>available online</u>

- Work with manufacturers
- Might need additional documents if required by importing authority

Review and, if required, including Dietary Exposure Assessment (DEA) by importing economy authority

- Establish import MRL if acceptable
- Decline if not acceptable





## Closing thoughts- What are the emerging MRL challenges?

- Loss/Lowering of MRLs in global markets
  - Need to expand market options for farmers
- Violations Damage Food Safety Confidence
  - Need to maintain trust in regulators and science
- Codex MRLs may not exist
  - Need efficient mechanism to gain alternative MRLs
