

- Targeted users: risk assessors, plant protection officers, quarantine officers, protected area managers and researchers
- To identify pests already in neighbouring countries for surveillance, pathway management and contingency planning
- To quickly generate a pest list for a plant commodity pathway-initiated PRA
- To prioritize species for pest-initiated PRAs



Challenges & Opportunities for Capacity Building on PRA

- More trainings on PRA and decision support tools/databases
 - Tools to assess likelihood of pest establishment
 - BIO-CLIM, CLIMEX
 - Decision support tool to aid the selection of appropriate measures for reducing risk and facilitating the safe movement of plants and plant products
- Increase horizon scanning activities
- Establish/strengthen PRA teams
- Establish national/regional harmonised approaches for PRA
- Extend scope to BCA and LMOs
- Share good PRA practices





Future improvements for the CABI tools

- Additional features for pest prioritization in the Horizon Scanning and PRA Tools
- PRA Tool translations, French as priority
- Conduct regional/trade bloc risk assessments
- PRA Tool addition for risk analysis of BCAs and LMOs (intentional introductions)
- Address climate change in horizon scanning and PRA
- Use of CABI Tools for Self-study online PRA training programmes
