Addendum

The Permanent Mission of Austria has provided the following information on preferential imports under the Austrian GSP in 1983.

Review of preferential imports under the Austrian GSP scheme (1983); structure, development and trends

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Annexes A and B containing further details are available in the secretariat for inspection by interested delegations.

1. In 1983 total imports under the GSP amounted to S 5,126,192,333 (US\$285.4 million). This figure represented an increase of 19 per cent over such imports in 1982 in terms of Austrian Shillings. Imports of products falling within CCCN chapters 1-24 under the GSP amounted to S 389,884,875 representing a decrease of 20 per cent and those of products falling within CCCN chapters 25-99 amounted to S 4,736,307,458 representing an increase of 9 per cent.

1.1 On legislative grounds, Portugal is included in the list of preference-receiving countries under the Austrian GSP scheme. Portugal being a member state of EFTA, Portuguese exports to Austria, however, are treated under the terms of the EFTA-Agreement and not under the - less favourable - GSP terms. Thus, imports from Portugal have not been taken into account in any of the lists, reviews or information attached.

A. Preferential imports in 1983 by preference-receiving country

2. Preferential imports from the following 62 preference-receiving countries were recorded in 1983. Certain comparable data for previous years are also provided.

5. In 1983 the trend to a greater diversification of imports from preference-receiving countries again slowed down. The first two suppliers, Yugoslavia and the Republic of Korea, reached together 41,50 % from total preferential imports; together with the third supplier, again Romania, the 50 per cent-limit was only slightly surpassed (53,80 %). The first ten suppliers totalled in 1983 87,75 % of preferential imports. The shares of these suppliers in 1972- 1982 were as follows:

6. With respect to the 62 preference-receiving countries listed in para. 2, the attached table on pages 12-19 shows total imports, dutiable imports and preferential imports in 1983 and the percentage shares of preferential imports in total imports and dutiable imports.

7. The information given in the table shows still great divergencies in the degree of utilization of the benefits offered under the Austrian scheme, but in general the rate of utilization is improving for most preference-receiving countries. It is to be noted that also for 1983, preferential imports are calculated on the basis not only of total imports from individual preference-receiving countries, but also on the basis of dutiable imports from these countries. Thus, the Review again gives a comprehensive and by and large realistic information on the effective degree of utilization. On the basis of these complete information it can be seen that the degree of utilization of most preference-receiving countries is substantially higher than it could be assumed on the basis of earlier, but less complete information. Since information is now given on the percentage share of preferential imports from both total and dutiable imports, a complete survey is given on the effective utilization of the Austrian GSP scheme by various preference-receiving countries. It is to be understood that "dutiable imports" means "dutiable on an mfn-basis" as explained of para. 5 of the Introduction.

8. In this connexion it is recalled that some very important preferential imports into Austria cannot be recorded. This applies in particular to bananas (CCCN No. ex 08.01), raw coffee beans (ex 09.01), raw cocoa beans (ex 18.01) and crude oil (CCCN 27.09) for which mfn-duties are temporarily suspended on a world-wide basis, although these items are included in the Austrian scheme. For information, the 1983 import data for these four items are given below (in 1000 A.Sh.):

9. From the least developed countries, Afghanistan, Bangladesh, the Comoros, Haiti, Lesotho, Mali, Nepal and Tanzania have shown up as beneficiary suppliers in 1983. The following land-locked developing countries were among the preferential suppliers: Afghanistan, Bolivia, Lesotho, Nepal, Mali, Paraguay, Swaziland and Zimbabwe. Among the developing island countries and territories, the following were recorded as suppliers: Comoros, Cyprus, Grenada, Haiti, Hongkong, Indonesia, Jamaica, Macao, Madagascar, Malta, Mauritius, Netherl. Antilles, Papua-New-Guinea, Philippines, Seychelles, Singapore, Sri Lanka, Taiwan and Trinidad and Tobago.
