## RESTRICTIONS ON IMPORTS FROM ROMANIA

### Notifications by Contracting Parties

#### Addendum

1. Six notifications of restrictions on imports from Romania were circulated in document L/5770 dated 11 January 1985.
2. The following notifications have been received from Australia, Cyprus, Iceland, Nigeria, Poland, South Africa, Sweden and Turkey.
3. Contracting parties which have not yet submitted notifications are invited to do so without delay.

#### AUSTRALIA

With reference to GATT/AIR/2084 my authorities have asked me to inform you that Australia does not maintain any restrictions on imports from Romania which are inconsistent with Article XIII of the General Agreement. This is consistent with Australia's notification incorporated in L/4343/Add.1.

#### CYPRUS

With reference to your letter Ref. GATT/AIR/2084 dated 23 November 1984, I wish to inform you that the Republic of Cyprus does not maintain any discriminatory prohibitions or quantitative restrictions on imports from Romania.

#### ICELAND

With reference to GATT/AIR/2084 of 23 November 1984 I wish to confirm that on 1 January 1985 Iceland did not apply any discriminatory prohibitions to imports from Romania.

#### NIGERIA

With reference to your letter No. GATT/AIR/2084 dated 23 November 1984, on the above subject I wish to confirm that Nigeria does not maintain any discriminatory restrictions on imports from Romania.

POLAND

With reference to GATT/AIR/2084 of 23 November 1984 I have the honour to inform you that Poland does not maintain any discriminatory prohibitions or quantitative restrictions to imports from Romania

SOUTH AFRICA

I refer to GATT/AIR/2084 of 23 November 1984 and have the honour to inform you that South Africa does not maintain any discriminatory prohibition or quantitative restrictions against imports from Romania.

SWEDEN

With reference to GATT/AIR/2084, I have the honour to submit herewith a list of products subject to restrictions when imported into Sweden from Romania.

The commodities mentioned below are subject to licensing and quantitative restrictions when imported from Romania. This notification is made with reference to para 3(b) of the Protocol for the Accession of Romania to the GATT

1) Further unilateral Swedish liberalizing measures apply as from 1 January 1985 for a number of products covered by these items. Pending forthcoming bilateral trade consultations in 1985, appropriate quota headings and corresponding quotas will be determined in due course. The products thus liberalized are now liable to surveillance licensing (AL) only.

2) Plastic and rubber boots were liberalized as from 1 January 1985. As for other footwear that remain subject to import licensing, the Swedish Government anticipates that agreement will be reached on a bilateral quota.

3) Restrictions earlier applied on zinc oxide and household chinaware were abolished as from 1 January 1985; now, only surveillance licensing (AL) applies for these goods.

TURKEY

With reference to airgram GATT/AIR/2084 of 23 November 1984, and on the instructions of my Government, I have the honour to inform you that Turkey does not apply any discriminatory quantitative restrictions on imports from Romania.
