Addendum

Attached is the text of the notes exchanged between the Government of the United States and the Government of Turkey amending the bilateral agreement concluded between the two countries, concerning trade in cotton textiles.

This information has been transmitted to the Director-General by the United States Mission for notification to the Cotton Textiles Committee.

Excellency,

I have the honour to refer to the cotton textile agreement between our two Governments effected by an exchange of notes dated 17 July 1964<sup>1</sup>, and to recent discussions in Washington between representatives of our two Governments concerning exports of cotton textiles from Turkey to the United States.

As a result of these discussions I propose that the agreement be amended by changing "1967" in paragraph 7 to "1970".

If this proposal is acceptable to the Government of the Republic of Turkey, this note and your Excellency's note of acceptance on behalf of the Government of the Republic of Turkey shall constitute an amendment to the agreement between our Governments.

Accept, Excellency, the renewed assurances of my highest consideration.
