CONSOLIDATED LISTS OF RESIDUAL IMPORT RESTRICTIONS¹

1. Under the procedures adopted by the CONTRACTING PARTIES for dealing with residual import restrictions (see BISD, Ninth Supplement, page 19) contracting parties applying import restrictions inconsistently with the provisions of GATT and without authorization from the CONTRACTING PARTIES were invited to communicate lists of their restrictions to the Executive Secretary.
2. The import restrictions to be notified by contracting parties in accordance with paragraph 7 of the Procedures for dealing with Residual Import Restrictions are:
 - (i) those import restrictions which, in the judgement of the notifying government, are inconsistent with the provisions of the General Agreement and in respect of which no authorization has been obtained from the CONTRACTING PARTIES;
 - (ii) import restrictions which are as described in (i) but the maintenance of which, in the judgement of the notifying government, is permitted under the terms on which that government is applying provisionally the General Agreement.
3. At their eighteenth and nineteenth sessions, the CONTRACTING PARTIES examined the notifications which had been made by contracting parties and appointed a Panel of Experts on Notifications of Residual Restrictions to examine the adequacy of the notifications received. Contracting parties were urged to supply the necessary information.
4. The Panel of Experts met in January and May 1962 and submitted two reports; the interim report (L/1716) was approved by the Council in February 1962 and the final report (L/1774) has been submitted to the Council for approval at its meetings to be held from 24 May 1962. The final report contains a stocktaking of the adequacy of the notifications and notes on the position or notification of various contracting parties.

5. The present document contains list of residual restrictions of fifteen contracting parties, which apply such restrictions. Twenty-two other contracting parties have stated that they do not apply such restrictions. Only four contracting parties have not supplied information (see L/1774, Part I).

1. AUSTRALIA

1. The remaining Australian residual import restrictions are of limited scope and cover less than 10 per cent of total imports. The attachment lists the commodities still subject to licensing control and the type of control covering each commodity.
2. The meaning of the symbols used in the attachment describing the types of control is as follows:
 - A. Quotas for the goods covered by the particular category item are established with collectors of customs in favour of individual importers and that licences for these goods may be secured by them up to the level of the quota in each four-month licensing period. The level of quotas varies with individual items, some being based on 1950/51 imports (with levels between 80 per cent and 220 per cent) and others on imports in the 1959 calendar year (with levels between 100 per cent and 150 per cent).
 - B. Quotas covering all goods under this treatment are established with collectors of customs in favour of individual importers and licences may be obtained covering any of those goods up to the level of the quota in each licensing period. The present level of Category B quotas is 150 per cent of imports in 1959 calendar year.
 - Adm. Goods are subject to administrative control and applications are examined on a case-by-case basis.
 - R. The goods are licensed under the Replacement Plan whereby licences are replaced as goods are imported against them.
3. The licensing treatment shown applies irrespective of country of origin.
4. At the February-March 1961 meeting of the Council the Australian representative explained why he was not able to make a statement about the plans for the removal of the remaining import restrictions.
5. In connexion with point (a)(ii) of the request it is advised that the importation of butter substitutes (tariff item 41B) is prohibited except under conditions specified in a regulation under Section 52(f) of the Customs Act 1901 which provides that imported butter substitutes must be coloured or branded as prescribed. This prohibition is covered by the Protocol of Provisional Application.

2. AUSTRIA

The Government of Austria has transmitted to the CONTRACTING PARTIES three lists of products the import of which into Austria is liberalized vis-à-vis all contracting parties to GATT with the exception of Czechoslovakia, Cuba and Japan. These lists came into force on 15 July 1960, 1 July 1961 and 1 January 1962 respectively. The last one of the three lists was forwarded to contracting parties on 15 February 1962 with document L/1725.

The question of compiling a "negative list" is still under consideration by the Austrian Government (cf. Report of Panel of Experts on Notifications of Residual Restrictions (L/1774), paragraph 8).

3. BELGIUM AND LUXEMBURG

The restrictions listed hereunder are imposed on imports into the Belgian-Luxemburg Economic Union. In fact, apart from the special system applied to certain agricultural products under the waiver granted to Luxemburg, the import control system applied by Belgium is equally valid for Luxemburg by virtue of the provisions of the Convention of 25 July 1921.

5. FRANCE

1. The Government of France has transmitted:
 - (a) A "negative list" of products subject to licensing control when imported from former OEEC countries¹, Canada and the United States. This is reproduced on the following pages.
 - (b) A "positive list" of products the import of which has been liberalized for specified countries other than the former OEEC countries, Canada and the United States. This is not included in the present document, but will be distributed to contracting parties separately.
2. In transmitting these lists, the French authorities have stated that:
 - (a) With respect to the industrial products included in the negative list, the French Government considers that the maintenance of a licensing system is consistent with the relevant provisions of the General Agreement.
 - (b) In the case of agricultural products, a thorough study of the legislation applicable in France and also of the various GATT texts and protocols in force has not so far permitted any final classification to be made of those products under the headings mentioned in GATT/AIR/224. It is therefore possible that some of these products might be considered under the present text of the General Agreement as being subject to residual restrictions.

Sizes of quotas

The size of a bilateral quota is determined in agreement with the most interested suppliers to assure reasonable access to the market.

Discretionary licensing

Discretionary licensing is administered in a liberal way with regard to suppliers who export on normal competitive conditions.

Areas of application

The articles mentioned in the list are under licensing control for all GATT contracting parties. The liberal way in which the DL system is applied means that the restrictive effect of the control is hardly significant for normal imports.

Duration of restrictions

In general it can be stated that it is the policy of the Netherlands Government to eliminate all the remaining quantitative restrictions as soon as circumstances permit. This result could be achieved in a short period if the Netherlands Government could be sure that no imports under exceptional conditions would take place.

9. PORTUGAL

1. The products listed in the schedule of residual restrictions are subject to the following import systems:

- (a) global quotas open to contracting parties which the Portuguese Government intends to establish, the list of which the Portuguese delegation hopes to be able to submit to the CONTRACTING PARTIES in the near future;
- (b) quotas under bilateral agreements entered into with certain contracting parties;
- (c) import authorizations in respect of goods to which global or bilateral quotas do not apply, provided, however, that when each individual case is examined a determination is reached that the products, import of which is being requested, are of interest to the country and that the issuance of the corresponding licences does not cause serious inconvenience.

2. The Portuguese lists of residual restrictions and the liberalization of items which do not appear therein will be applicable in respect of all contracting parties.

3. As mentioned in the statement which appears in document L/1563/Add.4, the Portuguese Government intends to eliminate gradually and as soon as possible those residual restrictions which are still being maintained. The Portuguese delegation, however, is not at present in a position to provide further information in this respect.

Additional Items to List 1

In the course of the consultation on the agricultural policy followed in European territories of Portugal, which was conducted by Committee II and completed on 16 November 1961 (see document L/1652), members of the Committee submitted comments from which it could be inferred that they all have doubts as to the conformity with the General Agreement of the systems under which certain Portuguese inter-professional groups and economic co-ordination bodies effect purchases of certain agricultural products whose import they control the list of which has been reproduced in paragraph 20 of document L/1652. Moreover, flour from cereals (tariff item No. 11.01) which was inadvertently omitted from this list should be added. In the circumstances, and so long as it is not possible to introduce in the existing systems those modifications which the CONTRACTING PARTIES might deem necessary, the Portuguese delegation would be prepared to accept that products imported under such systems which have not been included in the list of goods, are still subject to residual import restrictions in the European territories of Portugal and should be added to the list. The Portuguese delegation wishes to stress that the inclusion of such products in the above-mentioned list is requested only for the reason already given and in the spirit of the latter part of paragraph 5(a) of document L/1716 and that such inclusion does not in any way imply that the import systems applicable to such products have been made less liberal.

10. FEDERATION OF RHODESIA AND NYASALAND

Nature of restriction

Quantitative import control.

Products covered

Second-hand clothing and new or unused military-type clothing.

Quotas for period January-June 1962

- (i) Greatcoats (including overcoats and dustcoats, but excluding waterproof clothing):
may be imported, subject to licence, without limit as to number or value.
- (ii) Jackets: 68,000.
- (iii) Other clothing: £32,500 in total value.

Reasonable importations by small traders and bona fide religious organizations are permitted outside the quota.

Area of applicability

The restriction applies to imports from all sources; imports against quota may be made from any countries which are either in the sterling area or listed in the Second Schedule to the Control of Goods (Import) Open General Licence of 1962.

Intended duration

Indefinite. Half-yearly quotas are subject to review in January and June of each year.

11. SIERRA LEONE

1. In the following cases Sierra Leone has imposed import restrictions which may be regarded as inconsistent with the General Agreement.

- (1) 042-XXO - Rice - Government has reserved to itself the right to import rice and only permits commercial importation under special arrangements. The reason for the restriction is the fact that local rice which is the country's main staple food is bought by the Government at a subsidized price and sold below cost after milling. There is no immediate prospect of removing the restriction but the subsidy is being progressively reduced.
- (2) Japanese textiles - There is a limit of £2 million a year on imports of Japanese textiles. Other Japanese goods are under Open Licence.
- (3) Union of South Africa products - Imports from the Union of South Africa are subject to specific licences and licences are refused in accordance with the policy of the Sierra Leone Government not to trade with a country which discriminates on grounds of race against the great majority of Africans.
- (4) Country subject to specific licensing - The following countries which are contracting parties to the General Agreement or about to become so are subject to import licensing by specific licences and not by Open General Licence. At present import licences are granted freely to these countries.

Brazil
Czechoslovakia
Finland
Uruguay
Israel
Japan (for textiles - see (2) above).

The licensing system has been retained for control purposes to allow restriction to be imposed at short notice on balance-of-payments grounds should the necessity arise. It is impossible to say how long the restriction will be retained.

2. There are other restrictions on imports into Sierra Leone but it is considered that all these are covered by Articles XX and XXI.

12. SWEDEN

The Swedish import restrictions which still remain in force are all permitted under the terms on which the Swedish Government is applying provisionally the General Agreement, that is under the Annex Protocol of 10 October 1949. Consequently Sweden has nothing to report in answer to point (a)(i). The remaining restrictions - applied in accordance with point (a)(ii) - relate to the following commodities:

- (1) ex 03.01 salmon, cod, herring (except sprats) and scrappfish, fresh, chilled or frozen
- ex 03.01 fillets of herring and mackerel, fresh, chilled or frozen
- ex 03.02 baltic herring, certain other herrings and mackerel, salted, ling, dried ("spillanga")

- (2) ex 02.01 meat of horses and cattle, pork, fresh, chilled or frozen
- 02.02 dead poultry and edible offals thereof (except liver), fresh, chilled or frozen
- ex 02.03 poultry liver (except goose liver), fresh, chilled, frozen or salted
- ex 02.06 pork, salted, dried or smoked
- 04.02 milk and cream, preserved, concentrated or sweetened
- ex 04.05 eggs not in shell, egg yolks
- ex 11.08 starches
- ex 16.02 pork and poultry meat, preserved or prepared, preserved pork and beans, in airtight containers
- ex 18.06 icecream powder and pudding powder, containing cocoa
- ex 35.02 ovalbumin, liquid.

It should be noted that items under (2) are subject to licences except when imported from the OEEC countries, the sterling area, the Belgian, Dutch, French, Italian, Portuguese and Spanish currency areas, Finland, Yugoslavia, Guinea, Indonesia, Iraq and Somalia included.

In this connexion it may be recalled that Sweden - in accordance with the proposal put forward in the Intersessional Committee in April 1958 - notified the GATT secretariat in October 1958 of the legislation for which reservations might be made in case the General Agreement is ratified in accordance with the provisions of the Resolution of 7 March 1955 (cf. L/905 of 5 November 1958).

13. UNITED KINGDOM

1. The following is a list of products subject, on importation into the United Kingdom from countries to which the United Kingdom programme of relaxation of import restrictions normally applies, to restrictions imposed contrary to the provisions of the General Agreement and without authorization from the CONTRACTING PARTIES.¹

2. As regards the intended duration of the restrictions, the United Kingdom Government intend to make further progress in removing the import restrictions listed above as soon as possible, although there are some special problems which it will take time to resolve. A programme of relaxation is envisaged for watches which will result in full liberalization by 31 December 1969. Bilateral quotas for butter relate to the year ending 31 March 1963.

3. As regards point (a)(ii) of the request, none of the import restrictions described above is applied under the terms of the Protocol of Provisional Application.

4. For import licensing purposes in the United Kingdom, the world is divided into five areas. These are:

1. The Dollar Area, comprising:

Bolivia, Canada, Colombia, Costa Rica, Cuba, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, El Salvador, Guatemala, Haiti, Republic of Honduras, Liberia, Mexico, Nicaragua, Panama, Philippines, United States of America, Venezuela.

2. The Eastern Area, comprising:

Albania, Bulgaria, Czechoslovakia, Germany (Soviet Zone), Hungary, North Korea, North Vietnam, The Peoples Republic of China, Outer Mongolia, Poland, Roumania, Union of Soviet Socialist Republics.

3. Japan.

4. The Relaxation Area, which comprises the rest of the world and includes the Scheduled Territories as defined below.

5. The Scheduled Territories, comprising:

British Commonwealth (except Canada), British Trust Territories, British Protectorates and Protected States, Burma, Irish Republic, Iraq, Iceland, Jordan, Libya and South Africa. Muscat and Oman are treated as being within the Scheduled Territories for import licensing purposes.

14. UNITED STATES

I. United States applies no restrictions which require modification under (a) (i) of the request.

II. The following is a list of the import restrictions which are inconsistent with the provisions of the General Agreement but are permitted under the terms on which the United States is applying provisionally the General Agreement.

1. (a) Copyright legislation prohibits the importation of more than 1,500 copies of most books in the English language for which the United States copyright is obtained. (17 USC 16).
