Notification by Austria

Addendum

In a communication dated 11 January 1983 the Permanent Mission of Austria has provided the following information on preferential imports under the Austrian GSP scheme in 1981.

Annex A contains information on imports from all countries and territories which may receive tariff preferences under the Austrian scheme, i.e. imports from all potential beneficiaries. Information is given countrywise on

- total imports,
- total imports dutiable on an mfn-basis,
- total imports of goods covered by the Austrian scheme (potential preferential imports), and
- imports which actually received preferential tariff treatment.

Annex B contains information as to major preferential imports on a commodity-by-commodity basis.¹ Only those items have been taken into account which totalled at least one million Austrian Shillings (A.Sh.) in 1981. The information indicates

- the total imports from all countries of the world of that item,
- the total value of imports of that item from preference-receiving countries,
- the total value of dutiable imports of that item from preference-receiving countries (dutiable to be understood on an mfn-basis),
- the total value of dutiable imports of that item from preference-receiving countries covered by the Austrian scheme,
- the total value of imports of that item which actually received preferential tariff treatment, and
- a splitting-up of all these figures for the four main suppliers among the preference-receiving countries.

¹ As far as CCCN chapters 1 to 24 are concerned, information in Annex B is given on a subheading level in order to enable a direct comparison with the Austrian preferential offer in the field of agricultural items. For items falling within chapters 25 to 99, the information is given on a four-digit heading level.

1. Total preferential imports¹ amounted to 4,002,770,687² compared with 1980, preferential imports fell back by 11 %. Preferential imports of products falling within CCCN chapters 1 - 24 amounted to 402,807,113 decreasing by 17%. Preferential imports of products falling within CCCN chapters 25-99 amounted to 3,599,963,574 with a rate of decrease of 10%.

1.1. It should be noted in this context that 1981 was the first year in which the exclusion of Spain from the preference-receiving countries under the Austrian scheme became fully effective. 1981 was also the first year in which Greece was excluded from the preference-receiving countries. On legislative grounds, Portugal is included in the list of preference-receiving countries under the Austrian GSP scheme. Portugal being a member state of EFTA, Portuguese exports to Austria, however, are treated under the terms of the EFTA-Agreement and not under the - less favourable - GSP terms. Thus, imports from Portugal have not been taken into account in any of the lists, reviews or information attached.

A. Preferential imports in 1981 by preference-receiving country

2. Preferential imports from the following 64 preference-receiving countries were recorded in 1981. Certain comparable data for 1976, 1977, 1978, 1979 and 1980 are also provided.

5. In 1981 the trend to a greater diversification of the sources of preferential imports slowed down. The first two suppliers, Yugoslavia and the Republic of Korea between them accounted for 33.98 per cent in total preferential imports, together with the third supplier, Hong Kong, 47.48 per cent and with Taiwan, the fourth supplier, 59.54 per cent. In 1981 the first ten suppliers accounted for 83.84 percent of total preferential imports. The shares of these suppliers in 1972-1980 were as follows:

6. With respect to the 64 preference-receiving countries listed in para. 2, the attached table on pages 13-20 shows total imports, dutiable imports and preferential imports in 1981 and the percentage shares of preferential imports in total imports and dutiable imports.

7. The information given in the table shows still great divergencies in the degree of utilization of the benefits offered under the Austrian scheme, but in general the rate of utilization is improving for most preference-receiving countries. It is to be noted that the shares of preferential imports are calculated on the basis not only of total imports from individual preference-receiving countries, but also on the basis of dutiable imports from these countries. Thus, the Review gives comprehensive and realistic information on the effective degree of utilization. On the basis of this complete information it can be seen that the degree of utilization of most preference-receiving countries is substantially higher than it could be assumed on the basis of earlier, but less complete information. Since information is now given on the percentage shares of preferential imports in both total and dutiable imports, a complete survey is given on the effective utilization of the Austrian GSP scheme by various preference-receiving countries. It is to be understood that "dutiable imports" means "dutiable on an mfn basis".

8. In this connexion it is recalled that some very important preferential imports into Austria cannot be recorded. This applies in particular to bananas (CCCN No. ex 08.01), raw coffee beans (ex 09.01), raw cocoa beans (ex 18.01) and crude oil (CCCN 27.09) for which mfn duties are temporarily suspended on a worldwide basis, although these items are included in the Austrian scheme. For information, the 1981 import data for these four items are given below (in 1000 A.Sh.):

9. Among the least developed countries, Afghanistan, Bangladesh, the Comoros, Ethiopia, Haiti, Lesotho, Nepal and Tanzania have shown up as beneficiary suppliers in 1981. The following land-locked developing countries were among the preferential suppliers: Afghanistan, Bolivia, Lesotho, Nepal, Paraguay, Swaziland and Zambia. Among the developing island countries and territories, the following were recorded as suppliers: Comoros, Cyprus, Grenada, Haiti, Hongkong, Indonesia, Jamaica, Macao, Madagascar, Malta, Mauritius, Netherl. Antilles, Philippines, Seychelles, Singapore, Sri Lanka, St. Lucia, Taiwan and Trinidad and Tobago.
