INTERNATIONAL MEAT CONSULTATIVE GROUP

Revised Model Questionnaire

1. Attached is a revision of the draft model questionnaire based, inter alia, on the comments and suggestions received by the secretariat in response to document L/4168/Rev.1. The content and the format of the present draft will be the subject of discussion at the next meeting of the Consultative Group which is to be held in late March or early April.

The following points may be noted with respect to the revised version of the questionnaire:

General

2. In drawing up the draft model questionnaire it has been assumed that the format in which data is ultimately collated and presented would not necessarily follow the format adopted for its collection. For example, "bovine meat balances" for individual countries, if such analyses were required, would be derived from the information to be supplied in response to the questionnaire, including in particular information relating to the "carcass weight equivalent" of various elements of production and trade.

3. Throughout the tables "carcass weight" as opposed to "dressed carcass weight" has been used as the common basis or common denominator for expressing quantities. The former includes and the latter excludes "slaughter fats", as opposed to "graissé de découpe" which are sold with the meat and are included in both weight bases.

4. All tables have been updated to provide information to the end of 1978 and, in some cases, forecasts for 1979.

5. There was a suggestion that countries which receive the questionnaire be asked to indicate recent changes in their trade policies including tariffs and non-tariff measures such as quotas, licensing and health and sanitary regulations. If agreed, this could become Part E of the questionnaire.

Part A. Bovine Cattle Numbers and Herd Structure

6. The nomenclature of the breakdown of herd structure has been modified to provide further detail on the age and sex structure of the herd and a more distinctive separation between animals being kept for beef and for dairy purposes. It is recognized that such a complete separation of beef and dairy herds is less feasible in some countries, but at the same time, it is felt that this information, and its changes over time, can be strongly indicative of future production patterns in countries for which such information is available.

Part C. Trade

7. Table C.1.1 has been revised to incorporate the information formerly contained in table C.1.2 and table C.1.2 now contains the information formerly contained in table C.1.3.

8. Table C.3.1 has been revised to incorporate the information formerly contained in table C.3.2 and table C.3.2 now contains the information formerly contained in table C.3.3.

Part D. Prices

9. Table D.1 has been revised to incorporate new columns showing average prices received by producers, average retail prices for beef, average retail prices for the major competing meat, real per capita disposable income and the consumer price index.
