INTERNATIONAL MEAT CONSULTATIVE GROUP

Revised Questionnaire

1. Attached is a revision of the Group's questionnaire as amended at the Group's tenth meeting on 27 April 1978. The following points may be noted with respect to this questionnaire:

General

2. In drawing up the questionnaire it has been assumed that the format in which data is ultimately collated and presented would not necessarily follow the format adopted for its collection. For example "bovine meat balances" for individual countries, if such analysis were required, would be derived from the information to be supplied in response to the questionnaire, including in particular information relating to the "dressed carcass weight equivalent" of various elements of production and trade.

3. Throughout the tables "dressed carcass weight" as opposed to "carcass weight" has been used as the common basis or common denominator for expressing quantities. The former excludes and the latter includes "slaughter fats" and "kidney knot" as opposed to "graisse de découpe" which are sold with the meat and are included in both weight bases. Participants are requested to specify the basis and the coefficients used to arrive at a "dressed carcass weight equivalent".

Part A. Bovine cattle numbers and herd structure

4. The census date for the information requested has been changed to January for northern hemisphere countries and June for southern hemisphere countries or the closest census date thereto in either case. It is recognized that a complete separation of beef and dairy herds is not feasible in some countries, but at the same time, it is felt that this detailed information and its changes over time can be strongly indicative of future production patterns in countries for which such information is available.

Part B. Slaughter rates and production, stocks and consumption of bovine meat

5. In Table B.1 the livestock classes have been changed to "Cows and Heifers", "Adult Male Cattle" and "Calves".

Part E. Notification of policy changes

Part E has been added so that participants may indicate recent changes in their policies affecting trade in bovine meat, including tariffs and non-tariff measures such as quotas, licensing and health and sanitary regulations. For the first such notification by each participant, it is suggested that all policy changes from the situation described in document MTN/ME/W/8/Rev.3 of 5 October 1977 be included.
