ASSOCIATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE EUROPEAN ECONOMIC COMMUNITY AND GREECE

Communication from the Parties to the Agreement

Information for the Contracting Parties to GATT

1. Progress towards the attainment of the customs union established by the Agreement instituting an Association between Greece and the European Economic Community continued during the years 1976 and 1977.

As already reported in the previous communication¹, since 1 July 1968, when customs duties were entirely eliminated within the Six-member Community, Greek industrial products have been admitted into the Community in its original membership free of customs duties and of charges having equivalent effect. In addition, since 1 November 1962, quantitative restrictions on these products have been abolished.

Greek agricultural products listed in Annex III to the Association Agreement enjoy the same tariff treatment as the original EEC member States apply among themselves, that is to say a 100 per cent reduction in the basic duties. In general these are products of particular interest to Greece.

In addition, in accordance with the time-tables set by the Athens Agreement, since 1 November 1974 Greece has been applying total tariff exemption in respect of industrial products imported from the original Community and subject to a dismantlement period of twelve years.

On the other hand, industrial products subject to the twenty-two year tariff dismantlement period (i.e. products listed in Annex I to the Agreement) benefit since 1 May 1977 from a tariff reduction of 52 per cent of the basic duties when imported into Greece. On 1 November 1978 Greece brought into effect a further reduction of these duties so that the aggregate reduction is now 60 per cent.

Similarly, with respect to imports of agricultural products from the Community as originally constituted, Greece grants duty reductions in accordance with the time-table and categories provided in the Association Agreement. Accordingly, on the products listed in Annex III, the duty reduction process (subject to a twelve-year tariff dismantlement period) was completed on 1 November 1974. In the case of products listed in Protocol 13 (meat, fish, poultry, dairy products, etc.), Greece applies to imports of these products from the original member States of the EEC a 20 per cent reduction of the basic duties. Larger reductions are applied on ham (40 per cent), Europear-type cheeses (35 per cent) and butter (30 per cent).

- 2. For the remaining agricultural products, the standstill régime is applied by both the original Community and Greece.
- 3. Under the Additional Protocol signed on 28 April 1975, the new member States of the Community have carried out full tariff dismantlement in regard to Greece which was completed on 1 July 1977. Similarly, since 1 July Greece has been applying identical treatment to imports from all the member States of the Community.
- 4. So far as the elimination of quantitative restrictions is concerned, since 1 November 1972 Greece has bound the liberalization equivalent to 80 per cent of its private imports from the Community for the poor 1958. In addition, the quotas for non-liberalized products opened for the Community have continued to be increased by 20 per cent each eighteen months (Article 26:5).
- 5. The Greek customs tariff is being aligned by stages with the common customs tariff of the Community. For products subject to the twelve-year transitional period (Article 20, paragraph 1, of the Association Agreement for industrial products and Article 38 of that Agreement for agricultural products listed in Annex III), the common customs tariff has been fully applicable since 1 November 1974.

As regards products subject to the twenty-two year transitional period (products listed in Annex I), two approximations have been made effective, on 1 May 1970 and 1 November 1975 respectively. The first of these reduced by 20 per cent the difference between the Greek tariff and the CCT and the second reduced by 30 per cent the difference between the tariff resulting from the first approximation and the CCT, representing an aggregate reduction of the difference by 44 per cent. Nevertheless, for products on which the difference after the first approximation was less than 15 per cent, the CCT has been in effect since 1 November 1975. The next approximation will take place on 1 November 1979.

As already noted in the previous communication, the progressive alignment of the Greek customs tariff and the common customs tariff of the Community will eventually result, to a large extent, in a reduction in the customs duties applied by Greece on imports from countries other than the members of the Association.

6. Annexed hereto is a table showing the development of the foreign trade of Greece in the period 1962-1974.
