## FIFTH CERTIFICATION OF CHANGES TO SCHEDULES

## Schedule XXIV - Finland

The following communication, dated 30 June 1980 , has been received from the Permanent Mission of Finland.

The Permanent Mission of Finland presents its compliments to the recretariat of the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade ana has the honour to transmit herewith a rectification concerning Schedule XXIV - Finland. 1 Enclosed is also an explanatory memorandum ${ }^{2}$ containing tabulations, which show the rectified bindings.

The underlaying reason for the presen rectification is the planned new looseleaf system for Schedules, which has been negotiated in the GATT, and which shall enter into force 1 October 1980. This system implies that each binding be given its own sub-heading corresponding to the national customs tariff and that the Schedules be kept up-to-date with changes in the national tariff. In addition, some of the oldest bindings in the Schedule of Finland do not any more correspond to the national tariff. Consequently, some bindings have been rectified to comply with the requirements of the new 'system.

The new bindings have been reached through unification of different bindings at the level of the weighed average. The aim has been to calculate the bindings so that none of them would essentially rise and to secure compensation for the possible raises in other headings.

If no objection is notified to the secretariat within three months rom the date of the present document, the rectifications to Schedule XXIV - Finland will be deemed to be approved and will be included in the Fifth Certification of Changes to Schedules.
