SOUTH AFRICA

The following notification brings up to date South Africa's full reply on Subsidies contained in L/5102/Add.5.

Page 1

Par. I 1(c) should read as follows:

"During the financial year to 31 March 1982 an amount of R 7.0 million was disbursed for this purpose."

Page 3

Par. II 1(b) (i) Bread flower and meal - insert the following sentence in the third sub-paragraph after ".... and claimed back from the Government":

"The exception is brown bread meal and whole wheat meal in packages of 5 kg and less where the subsidy is paid to the millers."

Page 4/5

Par. II 1(d) Estimated amount of subsidy per unit should read as follows:

"The subsidy rates in respect of the financial year 1982/3 were as follows:

White bread	5,7369	cents per 900 grams
Brown bread	13,7230	cents per 900 grams
Whole wheat bread	13,6540	cents per 900 grams
Butter	19,72	cents per kg

Par. III 1(b) A (i) should read as follows:

"Subsidy is payable, on net box office receipts of both English and Afrikaans language films after net cinema income has reached an amount of R 100 000, at the following rates:

Net box office receipts	Subsidy rate
Up to R 1 000 000	70 %
R 1 000 001 to R 2 000 000	50 %
More than R 2 000 000	None

Page 8

Par. III 1(b) A(iii) should read as follows:

"The maximum subsidy per film is R 1 200 000."

Par. III 1(b) B should read as follows:

"Films in any of the other recognised South African languages

- (i) For films in one or several of the other recognised South African languages, the subsidy is paid on every admission ticket sold.
- (ii) Subsidy is paid as follows:
 - (a) tickets of 21 c or more : subsidy at 21 c per ticket sold.
 - (b) tickets of less than 21 c : subsidy equivalent to the price of the ticket sold.
- (iii) Subsidy is paid to a maximum amount of R 80 000 per film.
- (iv) Subsidy is payable on shows taking place up to 3 years only from the release date of a film."

(The abovementioned amendments to the subsidy scheme are applicable only to films released as from 1 April 1981.)
