# GENERAL AGREEMENT ON TARIFFS AND TRADE 

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## IMPORT QUOTA SYSTEM

Portugal
The following communication, dated 29 September 1983, has been received from the delegation of Portugal.

## SYSTEM OF QUOTAS FOR SOME CONSUMER GOODS

## PORTUGAL

1. Portugal has recently notified the Government Order n! 331-A/82, of 31 March 1983, and is doing now another notification of a measure of the same kind.

It is the intention of the Portuguese authorities not to delay the notification of measures affecting foreign trade as ocurred with the above-mentioned Government Order.
2. Unfortunately, the reasons referred in previous notifi cation are still valid and have recomended the application of the system of quotes for some consumer goods for another year.
3. In fact, where in 1979 the balance of current accounts was nearly $c$ Éset, a deep dezerioration occurred in 1980 and, since that year, the annual results have been worsening.

The deficit in 1980,1981 e 1982 has reached, respectively, the following values in $\$$ US dollars: 1,2 billion, 2,9 bil lion and 3,2 billion.
4. The above referred syster, introduced in 1977, has been maintained henceforth on a non discriminatory and temporary basis as a tool to avoid the continuing deterioration of the Portuguese balance of payments.

The general framework of the system was kept but some amendments were introduced in it,of which the following have to be emphasized:

- Three quotas were dropped (that for domestic clothes washing machines and those for certain kind of primary cells and batteries);
- The cases where the reversion for tradional importers of the 15 per cent reserve intended for new importers, when the share in that reserve has no ommercial value, are clarified;
- Although the coverage of the system was :duced fby the elimination of three quotas) the increasi $g$ in the remaining ones represents a global increas: in value of 27 per cent to take into account the Escudo devaluation and the inflation in the countries of origin of goods and to keep, as far as possible, the level of imports in terms of quantity;
- The lay-out of the description of goods was modified as far as sub-headings are concerned, as a consequence of the adoption of the struciure of the.EEC Common Custome Tariff.

6. The evolution of imports of less essential consumer goods under the system of quotas, as well as their ventilation by countries of origin over the period 1980/82, are contained in Annex II to this notification.

## Some Consumer Goods

Government Order n:673-A/83, of 9 June 1983
(Non-official translation)

The need to reduce the deficit in the balance of pay ments recommends the maintenance of the system of quotas for con sumer goods covered by Government Order no331-A/82, of 31 March.

Under present Order, that will be kept in force during one year period, the system of quotas will be maintained with the elimination of three quotas and the increase of the global value of the remaining quotas.

Some minor amendments and adjustments were introduced in the present system of quotas in order to fully reach its goals.

Therefore, under Decree-Law n:720-A'76, of 9 October:
The Government of the Portuguese Republic: through the Ministers of Finance and Planning, of Agriculture, Forestry and Food and of Industry and Energy, has decided as follows:

## Paragraph 1

As from 1 April 1983 to 31 March 1984 imports of goods on the List at Annex will be subject to the import quota system.

Paragraph 2
The Directorate General of External Trade (Direç̧ão--Geral do Comércio Externo), or other entities given powers for the granting of import licences, are empowered to allocate among importers the import quotas.

## Paragraph 3

Sub-paragraph 1: The criterion to be used as basis of allocation of quotas is the amount of imports made by each impor ter during 1975 and 1976. The annual import quota of each product subject to the system will be equal to the product of the arithme tic average of those imports by a ratio between the value of the global quota established for each product in this Government Order and the average value of the total imports of each product during 1975 and 1976. This criterion will be applied except as otherwise provided in the following sub-paragraphs; freedom of choice as to origin markets will be maintained.

Sub-paragraph 2: Evidence of the level of imports reached during that period, to be submitted to the entities mentioned in paragraph 2 above, will have to be made by means of proper Customs clearance forms.

Sub-paragraph 3: Evidence of the levels of imports du ring 1975 and 1976, to be presented by each importer, shall not be required whenever the proper Customs clearance forms have already been submitted to the entities referred to in paragraph 2 above.

Sub-paragraph 4: The ailocation criterion foreseen in sub-paragraph 1 above does not apply:
a) whenever another ailocation criterion is set through an enactment from the Secretary of State for the External Trade, for the quota for products classified under heading 08.01;
b) in the case of importers referrei to in next sub-para graph under(a).

Sub-paragraph 5: An amount of 15 per cent of each import quota shall be set apart for full allocation among:
a) importers who, having imported no goods subject to the quota concerned during 1975 and 1976, apply for imports of those goods durirg the deadine foreseen in next sub--paragraph;
b) importers already covered by sub-paragraph 1 hereof provided that their share in that quota will not in any case be lower than those of importers mentioned under (a) hereof.

Sub-- aragraph 6: Applications mentioned under (a) of the preceding sub-paragraph will have to be submitted until the end of the fifth month of enforcement of this Government Order.

Sub-paragraph 7: Whenever an enactment by the Secretary of State for the External Trade sets out a special allocation criterion in accordance with sub-paragraph 4 (a) above, it will specify whether or not the 15 per cent reserve scheme applies.

Sub-paragraph 8: If, from the allocation of the 15 per cent reserve scheme to the importers referred to in sub-paragraph 5 (a) above, results, for certain quota, an individual share repre senting a reduced amount with no commercial value, the referred allocation shall be canceled, unless, exceptionnally, otherwise decided by enactment by the Secretary of State for the External Trade. For this purpose will be considered as having no commercial value the shares allocated to the importers provided that their value is less than 10 per cent of the arithmetic average 0 E the shares of the same quota allocated in accordance with sub-こaragraph 1 of this paragraph.

Sub-panagraph 9: In those cases where the 15 per cent reserve was not allocated either by the reason referred tc in foregoing sub-paragraph or by lack of candidates under sub-paragraph 5 (a) of this paragraph, the shares, calculated in accor-

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dance with sub-paragraph 1 of this paragraph, will not be reduced from 1.5 icr cent of lisir value.

## Paragraph 4

Beyond the irport quotas set out in the list at Annex, authorization may be granted for additional impori quotas through a previous joint enactment by the Secretaries of State for the External Trade and for Industry. The value of these additio nal import quotas cannot exceed the national value added to Por tuguese exports:
a) Products manufactured by the Portuguese importer to be exported to the foreign manufacturer of the product to be imported;
b) Products manufactured by the Portuguese importer,regardless the destination country, if the compensation import product is included in the importer industrial activity area. These areas will be stated through the due Ministry of Industry and Energy ${ }^{\circ} s$ Departments;
c) Products from other national industries exported to and intended to be strictly used for industrial purposes by the foreign manufacturer that supplies the goods to be imported;
d) Capital goods produced by national manufacturers, regardless the destination country, included in the capital goods categories to be defined through the due Ministry of industry and Energy's Departments.

## Paragraph 5

For the purposes of the preceding paragraph, the necessary evidence of the export value shall be submitted to the Directorate General of External Trade (Direcçāo-Geral do Comércio Externo).

## Paragraph 6

Any doubtful cases arising from this Order will be settled through a joint enactment by the Rinisters of Finance and Planning, Trade and Tourism and by the Minister of Industry and Energy.

## Paragraph 7

The present Government Order produces its effects since 1 April 1983.
