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GENERALIZED SYSTEM OF PREFERENCES

Notification by Norway

Addendum

The following communication from the delegation of Norway, dated 14 March 1985, is circulated for the information of contracting parties.

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I have the honour to inform you that a major review of the Norwegian GSP scheme has recently been carried out with a view to further liberalizing the Norwegian import regime for developing countries.

The Norwegian Government has decided to add to its GSP scheme 34 agricultural and 13 industrial tariff positions or subpositions. Furthermore, it has been decided to include Macao in the scheme. The least-developed countries continue to enjoy full duty-free treatment for all products under the GSP scheme.

In Annexes I-IV please find details of the revised Norwegian GSP scheme. The revised scheme will enter into force from 15 March 1985.

This major review should be appreciated as a contribution to strengthen the confidence in the international trading system, and should also be regarded as my Government's response to the Part IV consultations and to the consultations on tropical products.

GENERALIZED SYSTEM OF PREFERENCES (GSP). SCHEME OF NORWAY - AMENDMENTS.

A major review of the Norwegian GSP scheme has recently been carried out with a view to further liberalization of the scheme. The results of the review are as follows:

1. 34 new tariff positions or parts of positions in the agricultural sector under CCCN Chapters 1-24 are included in the scheme and may enjoy preferential treatment (Annex I), with effect from 15 March 1985. This extension is effected by means of additions to the so-called "positive" list of agricultural products to which preferential treatment applies. This change does not affect quantitative or other types of restrictions which may apply to the products in question. The revised list of agricultural products covered by the scheme is to be found under "A" in ANNEX III.
2. 13 new tariff positions or parts of positions in the industrial sector under Chapters 25-99 are included in the scheme and may enjoy preferential treatment (Annex II), also with effect from 15 March 1985. This extension is effected by means of deductions from the so-called "negative" list of industrial products to which preferential treatment does not apply. Two of the positions (69.11 and 69.12) are transferred to the special list of exceptions applying to goods imported from the Republic of Korea (Annex III). The revised "negative" list (22 positions or parts of positions) is to be found under "B" in Annex III.
3. The Norwegian GSP scheme continues to provide for full duty-free treatment for all products admitted under the scheme, without tariff quotas or ceilings. The least developed countries continue to enjoy full duty-free treatment for all products under the GSP scheme, regardless of whether they are covered by the positive or negative list applicable to other beneficiaries.
4. Preference-receiving status is accorded to Macao with effect from 15 March 1985. In addition to the general list of exceptions (List B in Annex III), products under CCCN positions 42.02 and 42.03 are not covered by the scheme when imported from Macao. Part "C" in Annex III provides updated details on the particular regulations on imports of certain products from Bulgaria, Hong Kong, the Republic of Korea, Macao and Romania.
5. Annex III contains the product coverage of the Norwegian GSP scheme as amended.
6. In the list of beneficiaries under the Norwegian GSP scheme, some countries have been transferred from part B (dependent or administered countries and territories) to part A (independent developing countries). The updated country lists are contained in Annex IV.

As a result of this extension of the product coverage, the footnote on tropical fruit included in previous versions of the Norwegian GSP scheme is no longer applicable.

CCQN chapters 25 - 99. The positions listed below have from 15 March 1985 been removed from the negative list of industrial products not covered by the Norwegian GSP scheme.

Annex III

PRODUCT COVERAGE

(As from 15 March 1985)

A. AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS IN CCCN CHAPTERS 1 - 24.

The preferential tariff treatment applies to specific products registered in the Norwegian customs tariff, based on the CCC-nomenclature for the classification of goods in customs tariff (Chapters 1 - 99).

With effect from 1 June 1976 all goods from the least-developed countries are granted preferential tariff treatment. The names of these countries are written in capital letters on the country list.

Towards the remaining developing countries preferential tariff treatment within the CCC-nomenclature chapters 1 - 24 is, for the time being, granted only to the following products:

- ex 02.04 Frog legs.
- ex 03.02 Smoked fish, whether or not cooked before or during the smoking process, except smoked salmon.
- ex 03.03 Crustaceans and molluscs, whether in shell or not, fresh (live or dead), chilled, frozen, salted, in brine or dried; crustaceans, in shell, simply boiled in water, except shrimps.
- ex 04.05 Birds' eggs in shell, except chickens' eggs, unfit for human consumption.
- 04.06 Natural honey.
- 05.03 Horsehair and horsehair waste, whether or not put up on a layer or between two layers of other material.
- 05.05 Fish waste.
- 05.07 Skins and other parts of birds, with their feathers or down, feathers and parts of feathers (whether or not with trimmed edges) and down, not further worked than cleaned, disinfected or treated for preservation; powder and waste of feathers or parts of feathers.
- 05.12 Coral and similar substances, unworked or simply prepared but not otherwise worked; shells, unworked or simply prepared but not cut to shape; powder and waste of shells.
- 05.15 Animal products not elsewhere specified or included; dead animals of chapter 1 or chapter 3, unfit for human consumption.
- 06.01 Bulbs, tubers, tuberous roots, corms, crowns and rhizomes, dormant, in growth or in flower.
- 06.02 Other live plants, including trees, shrubs, bushes, roots, cuttings and slips.
- 06.03 Cut flowers and flower buds of a kind suitable for bouquets or for ornamental purposes, fresh, dried, dyed, bleached, impregnated or otherwise prepared.

- 06.04 Foliage, branches and other parts (other than flowers or buds) of trees, shrubs, bushes and other plants, and mosses, lichens and grasses, being goods of a kind suitable for bouquets or ornamental purposes, fresh, dried, dyed, bleached, impregnated or otherwise prepared.
- 07.01 Vegetables, fresh or chilled.
- 07.02 Vegetables (whether or not cooked), preserved by freezing.
- 07.03 Vegetables provisionally preserved in brine, in sulphur water or in other preservative solutions, but not specially prepared for immediate consumption.
- 07.04 Dried, dehydrated or evaporated vegetables, whole, cut, sliced, broken or in powder, but not further prepared.
- 07.06 Manioc, arrowroot, salep, Jerusalem artichokes, sweet potatoes and other similar roots and tubers with high starch or inulin content, fresh or dried, whole or sliced; sago pith.
- 08.01 Dates, bananas, coconuts, Brazil nuts, cashew nuts, pineapples, avocados, mangoes, guavas and mangosteens, fresh or dried, shelled or not.
- 08.02 Citrus fruit, fresh or dried.
- 08.03 Figs, fresh or dried.
- 08.04 Grapes, fresh or dried.
- 08.05 Nuts other than those falling within heading No 08.01, fresh or dried, shelled or not.

- 16.04 Prepared or preserved fish, including caviar and caviar substitutes.
- 16.05 Crustaceans and molluscs, prepared or preserved.

**B. INDUSTRIAL PRODUCTS IN CCCN CHAPTERS 25 - 99.**

Within the CCC-nomenclature Chapters 25 - 99 all goods from the least-developed countries are granted preferential treatment.

Towards the remaining developing countries the following goods are not entitled to preferential tariff treatment:

- 41.02 Bovine cattle leather (including buffalo leather) and equine leather, except leather falling within heading No. 41.06 or 41.08.
- ex 51.04 Woven fabrics of man-made fibres (continuous), including woven fabrics of monofil or strip of heading No. 51.01 or 51.02, except such fabrics containing more than 10 per cent by weight of silk and tyre cord fabrics.
- ex 53.11 Woven fabrics of sheep's or lambs' wool or of fine animal hair, except such fabrics containing more than 10 per cent by weight of silk.
- 55.05 Cotton yarn, not put up for retail sale.
- 55.06 Cotton yarn, put up for retail sale.
- ex 55.09 Other woven fabrics of cotton, except such fabrics containing more than 10 per cent by weight of silk.
- ex 56.07 Woven fabrics of man-made fibres (discontinuous or waste), except such fabrics containing more than 10 per cent by weight of silk.
- 60.01 Knitted or crocheted fabric, not elastic nor rubberised.

C. PARTICULAR REGULATIONS ON IMPORTS FROM BULGARIA, HONG KONG, THE REPUBLIC OF KOREA, MACAO AND ROMANIA:

In addition to the goods listed in subsection B (the "negative" list), the following products are not entitled to preferential tariff treatment on importation from the above-mentioned countries:

The Republic of Korea:

- 42.02 Travel goods (for example, trunks, suit-cases, hat-boxes, travelling-bags, rucksacks), shopping-bags, handbags, satchels, brief-cases, wallets, purses, toilet-cases, tool-cases, tobacco-pouches, sheaths, cases, boxes (for example, for arms, musical instruments, binoculars, jewellery, bottles, collars, footwear, brushes) and similar containers, of leather or of composition leather, of vulcanised fibre, of artificial plastic sheeting, of paperboard or of textile fabric.
- ex 42.03 Articles of apparel and clothing accessories of leather or of composition leather, except gloves other than working gloves.
- ex 61.10 Gloves, mittens and mitts, containing silk or continuous man-made textile fibres.
- ex 62.04 Tents.
- 69.11 Tableware and other articles of a kind commonly used for domestic or toilet purposes, of porcelain or china (including biscuit porcelain and parian).
- 69.12 Tableware and other articles of a kind commonly used for domestic or toilet purposes, of other kinds of pottery.
