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SOUTH PACIFIC REGIONAL TRADE AND ECONOMIC CO-OPERATION AGREEMENT

Second Biennial Report by Australia and New Zealand

The following communication, dated 7 June 1985, has been received from the Permanent Mission of Australia.

Please find enclosed the joint second biennial report by Australia and New Zealand on SPARTECA.

SOUTH PACIFIC REGIONAL TRADE AND ECONOMIC AGREEMENT:
SECOND BIENNIAL REPORT BY AUSTRALIA AND NEW ZEALAND TO THE GATT

The South Pacific Regional Trade and Economic Agreement (SPARTECA) came into operation on 1 January 1981, and was submitted for examination by contracting parties on 7 January 1981. At their 11 June 1981 meeting, the GATT Council agreed that Australia and New Zealand should submit a report on developments under the Agreement in accordance with the procedure for the biennial examination of reports on regional agreements (C/M/148). Members of the Agreement are Cook Islands, Fiji, Kiribati, Nauru, Niue, Papua New Guinea, Solomon Islands, Tonga, Tuvalu, Vanuatu, western Samoa (known collectively as the Forum Island Countries), Australia and New Zealand. The Republic of Vanuatu signed the agreement on 19 November 1981 and the Republic of Nauru on 8 August 1982. SPARTECA provides duty-free and unrestricted access to the Australian and New Zealand markets for most of the products exported by the Forum Island Countries. Australia and New Zealand provide these concessions on a non-reciprocal basis. In 1985, Australia and Papua New Guinea agreed that the Papua New Guinea/Australia Trade and Commercial Relations Agreement (PATCRA) would govern their bilateral trading relationship.

The Australian Schedules 1 and 2 to SPARTECA, revised as at 31 March 1985, are set out in Annexes I and II. The products covered by the revised Schedules 1 and 2 reflect the concessions granted by Australia in response to requests lodged by the Forum Island Countries prior to the signing of the Agreement, and include new concessions granted since the Agreement was signed.

The New Zealand Schedule of SPARTECA concessions is set out in Annex III. Following a review of the New Zealand Schedule (Schedule 5) a number of amendments were made to take effect from 9 April 1984. These amendments are also set out in Annex III.

SPARTECA is reviewed annually at the regional Committee on Trade meeting. Representatives from all signatories to the Agreement usually attend the RCT which also provides a forum for the interchange of views covering trade, industrial and technical cooperation.

The South Pacific Bureau for Economic Cooperation is responsible for overseeing the operation of SPARTECA and reports annually on developments under the Agreement to the South Pacific Forum.

The value of trade between the Forum Island Countries and Australia, and New Zealand is summarised in Annexes IV and V respectively.

1. A comparative analysis of the export performance of the Forum Island Countries (excluding PNG) with Australia was conducted on the following basis
 - comparison of calendar year 1984 (p) with calendar year 1983 import clearances from the FICs
 - the product range includes all items on Schedules 1 and 2 of SPARTECA as at 31 March 1985
 - . product identification is at the four digit level (CCCN Format)
 - . trade was recorded in 131 product groups
 - import clearances into Australia from the Forum Island Countries (FIC) under SPARTECA in 1984 were \$A94,604,000 compared with total import clearances into Australia of \$A95,969,000 from the same countries
 - . 98.6% of FIC goods exported to Australia in 1984 entered under SPARTECA.

2. The analysis revealed that:

- total import clearances under SPARTECA decreased by 11.2% over 1984
 - . from \$106,349,000 in 1983
 - details of total trade movements by country are set out in item 3
 - movements in the total trade figure are heavily influenced by exports of phosphate and gold
 - . markets for these products are determined by factors outside the influence of the SPARTECA
 - . import clearances of products excluding gold and phosphate for which concessional SPARTECA access was provided were:
 - 1983 \$10,739,080
 - 1984 \$18,825,181
- an increase of \$8,086,101 or 75.3%

3. Total FIC exports⁷ to Australia under SPARTECA

- seven FIC's achieved an increase in their exports to Australia over 1984
 - . Cook Islands, up 1290% (\$4,378 to \$60,858)
 - . Fiji, up 44% (\$24,740,400 to \$35,631,426)
 - . Solomon Islands, up 14% (\$724,517 to \$822,904)
 - . Tonga, up 46% (\$1,547,418 to \$2,259,960)
 - . Tuvalu, up 415% (\$7,309 to \$37,661)
 - . Vanuatu up 116% (\$95,817 to \$207,159)
 - . W. Samoa, up 24% (\$1,541,754 to \$1,907,088)

- three FICs experienced a decline in their exports to Australia

- . Kiribati, down 0.2% (\$7,105 to \$7,093)
- . Nauru, down 31% (\$77,660,883 to \$53,425,125)
- . Niue, down 44% (\$19,502 to \$10,838)

4. Of the 131 product groups in which trade was recorded over 1984

- 80 product groups registered an increase
- trade was recorded in 30 of these product groups for the first time. These "new" exports were valued at \$692,702 or 0.7% of total exports which entered under SPARTECA.
