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## SOUTH PACIFIC REGIONAL TRADE AND ECONOMIC CO-OPERATION AGREEMENT

Second Biennial Report by Australia and New Zealand

The following communication, dated 7 June 1985, has been received from the Permanent Mission of Australia.

Please find enclosed the joint second biennial report by Australia and New Zealand on SPARTECA.

## SOUTH YACIFIC REGGIONAL TRADE AND ECONOPIC AGKEEMEN'I:

 SECOND BIENNIAL REPURT BY AUSTRALIA AND NEW ZEALAND TO THE GATIThe South Pacific Regional Trade and Economic Agreement (SPARTECA) came into operation on 1 January 1981, and was submitted for examination by contracting parties on 7 January 1981. At their 11 June 1981 meeting, the GAl'P Council agreed that Australia and New Zealand should submit a report on developments under the Agreement in accordance witn the procedure for the biennial examination of reports on regional agreements (C/M/148). Mempers of the Agreement are Cook Istands, Fiji, Kiridati, Nauru, Niue, Papua New Guinea, Solomon Islands, 'longa, Tuvalu, Vanuatu, western samoa (known collectively as the forum Island Countries), Australia and New Zealand. 'The Republic of Vanuatu signed the agreement on $1 y$ November 1981 and the Repuolic of Nauru on 8 August 1902. SPARTECA provides duty-free and unrestricted access to the Australian and New Lealand markets for most of the products exported by the Forum Island Countries. Australia and New Zealand provide these concessions on a nonreciprocal basis. In 198j, Australia and Papua New Guinea agreed that the Papua New Guinea/Australia Prade and Commercial Relations Agreement (PAICRA) would govern their bilateral trading relationship.

The Australian Scnedules 1 and 2 to SPAR'IECA, revisea as at 31 March 1985, are set out in Annexes I and II. The products covered by the revised schedules 1 and 2 reflect the concessions granted by Australia in response to requests lodged by the forum Island Countries prior to the signing of the Agreement, and include new concessions grantea since the Agreement was sigred.

The New Lealand Scnedule of SPAK'EliA concessions is set our in Annex TT. Following a review of the New Lealand schedule (scnedule $S$ ) a number of amendments were made to take effect irou 9 April 1984. These amendments are also set out in Annex II.

SPAK'l'CA is reviewed annually at the negional Committee on lrade meeting. Kepresentatives from all signatories to the Agreement usually attend the KCl wnich also provides a forum for the interchange of views covering trade, industrial and technical cooperation.

The Soutn Pacific Eureau Ior E'conomic Cooperation is responsibie for oversighting the operation of SPARTECA and reports annually on developments under the Agreenent to the South Pacitic Forum.

The value of trade between the Forun Island Countries and Australia, and New Zealand is summarised in Annexes IV and $V$ respectively.
