1. In 1984 total imports under the GSP amounted to S 6,404,277,836 (US\$320.1 million). This figure represented an increase of 25 per cent over such imports in 1983 in terms of Austrian Shillings. Imports of products falling within CCCN chapters 1-24 under the GSP amounted to S 426,421,486 representing an increase of 9 per cent and those of products falling within CCCN chapters 25-99 amounted to S 5,977,856,350 representing an increase of 26 per cent.

1.1 Particular stress should be given to the fact that the term "dutiable imports" is to be understood to mean "dutiable on an m.f.n. basis". This interpretation, though being in line with international notification requirements, leads to rather unforeseen results in cases where the m.f.n. rates of duty are temporarily suspended by the Austrian government on a world-wide basis, whereas the same items are covered by the Austrian GSP scheme. In these cases the heading is indicated as m.f.n. dutiable, and no preferential imports have been recorded, since all imports of this item were admitted at nil rates of duty on the basis of the temporary suspension. This applies in particular to bananas (CCCN ex 08.01), raw coffee (ex 09.01), raw cocoa beans (ex 18.01) and raw oil (27.09). Attention is drawn to para. 8 where further information is given.

1.2. On legislative grounds, Portugal is included in the list of preference-receiving countries under the Austrian GSP scheme. Portugal being a member State of EFTA, Portuguese exports to Austria, however, are treated under the terms of the EFTA-Agreement and not under the less favourable GSP terms. Thus, imports from Portugal have not been taken into account in any of the lists, reviews or information attached.

2. Preferential imports from the following 63 preference-receiving countries were recorded in 1984. Certain comparable data for previous years are also provided.

5. In 1984 the trend to a greater diversification of imports from preference-receiving countries slightly recovered. The first two suppliers, Yugoslavia and the Republic of Korea, reached together 44,19 % from total preferential imports; together with the third supplier, now Taiwan, the 50 per cent-limit was surpassed (55,68 %). The first ten suppliers totalled in 1984 86,71 % from preferential imports (in 1983 the respective figure was 87,75 %, in 1982 84,97 %, in 1981 83,84 %, in 1980 79,38 %, in 1979 82,23 %, in 1978 81,97 %, in 1977 83,30 %, in 1976 84,25 %, in 1975 83,43 %, in 1974 88,53 %, in 1973 93,44 % and in 1972 95,18 %).

7. The information given in para. 6 above shows still great divergencies in the degree of utilization of the benefits offered under the Austrian scheme, but in general the rate of utilization is improving for most preference-receiving countries. The calculation of preferential imports is shown on the basis not only of total imports from individual preference-receiving countries, but also on the basis of dutiable imports from these countries. Thus, a comprehensive and by and large realistic information is given on the effective utilization of the Austrian GSP scheme by various preference-receiving countries. It is to be understood that "dutiable imports" means "dutiable on an mfn-basis".

8. In this connexion it is recalled that some very important preferential imports into Austria cannot be recorded. This applies in particular to Bananas (CCCN No. ex 08.01), raw coffee beans (ex 09.01), raw cocoa beans (ex 18.01) and crude oil (CCCN 27.09), for which mfn-duties are temporarily suspended on a world-wide basis, although these items are included in the Austrian scheme. For information, the 1984 import data for these four items are given below (in 1000 A.Sh.)

9. From the least developed countries, Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Botswana, the Comoros, Haiti, Mali and Nepal have shown up as beneficiary suppliers in 1984. The following land-locked developing countries were among the preferential suppliers: Afghanistan, Bolivia, Nepal, Mali, Paraguay, Zambia and Zimbabwe. Among the developing island countries and territories, the following were recorded as suppliers: Comoros, Cyprus, Dominican Republic, Grenada, Haiti, Hongkong, Indonesia, Jamaica, Macao, Madagascar, Malta, Mauritius, Netherl. Antilles, Philippines, Singapore, Sri Lanka, Taiwan and Trinidad and Tobago.
