# Notification by New Zealand

### Addendum

1. The following communication from the delegation of New Zealand, dated 25 July 1985, is circulated for the information of contracting parties.

"On 28 March we notified changes that were to be made to New Zealand's Generalized System of Preferences, with effect from 1 July 1985 (GATT reference L/4366 Add.15).

"In the context of these changes we should like to advise that the New Zealand Government is prepared to consider requests from any contracting party affected by implementation of the 70 per cent per capita GNP threshold for the possible reinstatement of developing country preferential rates on individual tariff items such countries may nominate.

"We should like to advise also that, as from 1 July 1985, Hungary has been added to the list of countries eligible for developing country preferences under New Zealand's GSP scheme."

- 2. Further, the delegation of New Zealand provided the attached list of 147 countries and territories which are, as of 1 July 1985, beneficiaries of New Zealand's GSP scheme. This list replaces the list of GSP beneficiaries in L/4366/Add.1 (pages 83/86), as amended by some other addenda to L/4366.
- 3. With reference to duty-free treatment granted to least-developed countries as from 1 July 1985, the delegation of New Zealand has notified that limited exceptions from this action covered baler twine, which was a product covered by an industry plan yet to be fully implemented, and certain items falling within Schedule 3 of SPARTECA, including passion fruit products, coconut cream, lime juice, articles of apparel and footwear. The latter exclusions were made in order to protect the already fragile economies of certain Pacific Island States rather than to protect New Zealand industry.

Affected countries include Kuwait, Singapore and Trinidad and Tobago.
