Notification by Austria

Addendum

The Permanent Mission of Austria has provided the following information on preferential imports under the Austrian GSP in 1987.

**Review of Preferential Imports
Under the Austrian GSP Scheme (1987);
Structure, Development and Trends**

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Annexes A and B containing further details are available in the secretariat for inspection by interested delegations.

1. In 1987 total imports under the GSP amounted to S 8,001,820,283 (US\$633 million), increasing by 31.99 per cent in terms of Austrian Shillings. Imports of products falling within CCCN Chapters 1-24 under the GSP amounted to S 522,942,852 representing an increase of 10.47 per cent and those of products falling within CCCN Chapters 25-99 amounted to S 7,478,877,431 representing an increase of 33.81 per cent.

1.1. Particular stress should be given to the fact that the term "dutiable imports" is to be understood to mean "dutiable on an m.f.n. basis". This interpretation, leads to rather unforeseen results in cases where the m.f.n. rates of duty are temporarily suspended by the Austrian Government on a world-wide basis, whereas the same items are covered by the Austrian GSP scheme. In these cases the heading is indicated as m.f.n. dutiable, and no preferential imports have been recorded, since all imports of this item were admitted at nil rates of duty on the basis of the temporary suspension. This applies in particular to bananas (CCCN ex 08.01), raw coffee (ex 09.01), raw cocoa beans (ex 18.01) and raw oil (27.09). Attention is drawn to paragraph 8 where further information is given.

A. Preferential imports in 1987 by preference-receiving country

2. Preferential imports from the following seventy-three preference-receiving countries were recorded in 1987. Certain comparable data for previous years are also provided.

5. In 1987 there was almost no trend towards a greater diversification of imports from preference-receiving countries. The first two suppliers, the Republic of Korea and Yugoslavia, reached together 43,94 % from total preferential imports; together with the third supplier, again Taiwan, the 50 per cent-limit was surpassed (56,22 %). The first ten suppliers totalled in 1987 85,34 % from preferential imports (in 1986 the respective figure was 86,40 %, in 1985 84,40 %, in 1984 86,71 %, in 1983 87,75 %, in 1982 84,97 %, in 1981 83,84 %, in 1980 79,38 %, in 1979 82,23 %, in 1978 81,97 %, in 1977 83,30 %, in 1976 84,25 %, in 1975 83,43 %, in 1974 88,53 %, in 1973 93,44 % and in 1972 95,18 %).

6. The information given in para. 6 above shows still great divergencies in the degree of utilization of the benefits offered under the Austrian scheme, but in general the rate of utilization continues to improve for most preference-receiving countries. The calculation of preferential imports is shown on the basis not only of total imports from individual preference-receiving countries, but also on the basis of dutiable imports from these countries. Thus, a comprehensive and by and large realistic information is given on the effective utilization of the Austrian GSP scheme by various preference-receiving countries.

7. In this connexion, however, it is recalled that some very important preferential imports into Austria cannot be recorded. This applies in particular to Bananas (CCCN No. ex 08.01), raw coffee beans (ex 09.01), raw cocoa beans (ex 18.01) and crude oil (CCCN 27.09) for which mfn-duties are temporarily suspended on a world-wide basis, although these items are covered by the Austrian scheme. For information, the 1987 import data for these four items are given below (in 1000 A.Sh.):

8. From the least developed countries, Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Botswana, Burma, the Comoros, Gambia, Haiti, Lesotho, the Maldives, Mali, Nepal and Tanzania have shown up as beneficiary suppliers in 1987. The following land-locked developing countries were among the preferential suppliers: Afghanistan, Bolivia, Botswana, Lesotho, Mali, Nepal, Paraguay and Zimbabwe. Among the developing island countries and territories, the following were recorded as suppliers: Comoros, Cyprus, Dominican Republic, Grenada, Haiti, Hong Kong, Indonesia, Jamaica, Macao, Madagascar, the Maldives, Malta, Mauritius, Papua-New-Guinea, Philippines, Singapore, Sri Lanka, St. Lucia, Taiwan and Trinidad and Tobago.
