RESTRICTIONS ON IMPORTS FROM HUNGARY

Notifications by Contracting Parties

In GATT/AIR/2711 of 1 November 1988, contracting parties were invited to notify by 31 January 1989, in accordance with paragraph 4(c) of the Protocol for the Accession of Hungary, discriminatory prohibitions and quantitative restrictions applied to imports from Hungary on 31 July 1988.

AUSTRIA

With reference to GATT/AIR/2711 of 1 November 1988 I have the honour to inform you that Austria does not apply discriminatory prohibitions and quantitative restrictions to imports from Hungary.

CANADA

In accordance with GATT/AIR/2711 of 1 November 1988, we wish to inform you that Canada does not apply any discriminatory prohibitions or quantitative restrictions to imports from Hungary.

HONG HONG

With reference to your GATT/AIR/2711 of 1 November 1988, I wish to inform you that Hong Kong does not maintain any discriminatory prohibitions or quantitative restrictions on imports from Hungary.

<u>MALTA</u>

The Permanent Mission of the Republic of Malta to the United Nations Office in Geneva presents its compliments to the secretariat of the GATT and, with reference to GATT/AIR/2711 of 1 November 1988, has the honour to state that Malta did not on 31 July 1988, and does not now, maintain any discriminatory prohibitions or restrictions on imports from Hungary.

NORWAY

I have the honour to inform you that Norway removed all quantitative restrictions on imports from Hungary 13 July 1984.

YUGOSLAVIA

In reference to your GATT/AIR/2711 dated 1 November 1988 concerning restrictions on imports from Hungary, the Permanent Mission of the Socialist Federal Republic of Yugoslavia presents its compliments to the GATT secretariat and has the honour to inform that no prohibitions and restrictions were in force in Yugoslavia on 31 July 1988.
