CANADIAN TARIFF TREATMENT FOR COMMONWEALTH CARIBBEAN COUNTRIES

First Report of the Government of Canada on the Trade-Related Provisions of CARIBCAN

Introduction

The Government of Canada introduced CARIBCAN as an economic and trade development assistance program for the Commonwealth Caribbean countries and territories. The legislation enacting CARIBCAN entered into force as of 15 June 1986. Copies of the legislation were circulated in the Annex to document L/6008.

The basic objectives of CARIBCAN are to enhance existing trade and export earnings, improve the trade and economic development prospects of the region, promote new investment opportunities, and encourage enhanced economic integration and cooperation within the region. The principal feature of CARIBCAN is the extension of unilateral preferential duty-free treatment to all eligible imports, with certain exceptions (textiles, clothing, footwear, luggage, handbags, leather garments, lubricating oils and methanol), originating in 89-0395

a country that is designated as a beneficiary of the Commonwealth Caribbean Countries tariff treatment.

On November 28, 1986, the CONTRACTING PARTIES to the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT), acting pursuant to the provisions of paragraph 5 of Article XXV of the General Agreement and in accordance with footnote 2 of paragraph 2 of the Framework Agreement, decided, inter alia, to waive until June 15, 1998, the provisions of paragraph 1 of Article I of the General Agreement. This obligation was waived "only to the extent necessary to permit the Government of Canada to provide duty-free treatment to eligible imports of Commonwealth Caribbean countries benefitting from the provisions of CARIBCAN, without being required to extend the same duty-free treatment to like products of any other contracting party"1. In accordance with paragraph 7 of that Decision, Canada is providing its first annual report to the GATT CONTRACTING PARTIES on the implementation of the traderelated provisions of CARIBCAN. This report includes data for calendar years 1985 to 1987. Data cannot be obtained separately for the part of year 1986 when CARIBCAN was in operation and the data collection lags associated with the implementation of a reduction in tariffs make the analysis of meaningful statistics difficult for this period.

Tariff Preferences for CARIBCAN Beneficiaries

The substance of the trade-related aspects of CARIBCAN were provided in GATT document L/5948 with regard to product, trade and beneficiary country coverage. In December 1987, the Customs Tariff which contained the CARIBCAN legislation was amended in order for Canada to adopt and implement the Harmonized Commodity Description and Coding System (HS), effective January 1, 1988. For the information of Contracting Parties, the revised legislation has been included as Annex 6 to this report and future reports will be based on the Harmonized System.

There are 18 countries or dependent territories which are eligible to receive the benefits of the outy-free provisions of CARIBCAN. These are: Anguilla, Antig and Barbuda, The Bahamas, Barbados, Belize, Bermuda, the British Virgin Islands, the Cayman Islands, Dominica, Grenada, Guyana, Jamaica, Montserrat, St. Christopher-Nevis, St. Lucia, St. Vincent and the Grenadines, Trinidad and Tobago, and the Turks and Caicos Islands. There have been no additions to or deletions from the number of eligible beneficiaries since CARIBCAN was enacted on June 15, 1986.

The CARIBCAN legislation also makes provision for the Government to suspend or withdraw the benefit of duty-free treatment in whole or in part from any beneficiary country.

Under the procedures which are to be followed in a review of any safeguard petition, there is opportunity for all interested parties, including representatives of beneficiary governments and exporters, to present their views. For the period under review, no safeguard petitions for the withdrawal of preferences under CARIBCAN were received.

Canadian Trade with CARIBCAN Countries

In the first full calendar year during which the dutyfree provisions of CARIBCAN have been in effect (1987), total
Canadian imports from the beneficiary countries increased by 0.6
percent over 1985, the last full calendar year before CARIBCAN
was implemented. However, imports of products now eligible for
duty-free treatment as a result of the implementation of CARIBCAN
more than tripled from \$1.2 million in 1985 to \$4 million in
1987.

Annex 1 contains a table showing the Canadian trade balance with CARIBCAN beneficiaries on a country-by-country basis and in total for the period 1985 to 1987. Annex 2 indicates the main imports by commodity groupings from CARIBCAN beneficiaries

on a country-by-country basis. Annex 3 shows those imports which were reduced to free under CARIBCAN (at the tariff item level) for each CARIBCAN beneficiary. Finally, Annex 4 gives the tariff treatment for principal imports from CARIBCAN beneficiaries in 1987 and Annex 5 presents a summary of these data.

ANNEX 6

Commonwealth Caribbean Gous 'ries

Application of tariff treatment

53. Subject to sections 54 to 57, the rates of customs duty under Schedule I shall be free in respect of goods that originate in a country that is listed in Schedule III as a beneficiary of the Commonwealth Caribbean Countries tariff treatment.

Withdrawal of benefit

- 54. (1) The Governor in Council may, on the recommendation of the Minister of Finance, by order,
- (a) withdraw the benefit of free rates of customs duty provided for by section 53 from any or all goods that originate in a country that is listed in Schedule III as a beneficiary of the Commonwealth Caribbean Countries tariff treatment and make those goods subject to the tariff treatment that would be applicable to those goods if they were not entitled to free rates of customs duty; and
- (b) amend Schedule III to the extent required to indicate the tariff treatment of the country to which the order applies.

Contents of order

- (2) An order made pursuant to subsection (1) shall
- (a) specify the date on which the order becomes effective; and
- (b) where the order withdraws in part the benefit of free rates of customs duty, indicate the goods to which the order applies.

No other Act to apply

55. Notwithstanding any other Act of Parliament or any regulation or order made thereunder, the benefit of free rates of customs duty provided for by section 53 does not apply, either generally or specifically or directly or indirectly, to goods that originate in any country to which that benefit does not specifically extend under that section.

Exceptions

- 56. The following goods are not entitled to the benefit of free rates of customs duty provided for by section 53:
- (a) goods of Chapters 50 to 65;
- (b) goods of heading No. 42.02 or 46.02;
- (c) goods of tariff item No. 2710.00.20, 2905.11.00, 3403.11.10, 3403.19.10 or 4203.10.00.

Conditions

- 57. Goods are entitled to the benefit of free rates of customs duty provided for by section 53 only if the following conditions are met:
 - (a) proof of origin of the goods is given and the origin is determined in accordance with this Act and the regulations; and
 - (b) the goods are shipped directly to Canada, with or without transhipment, from the country in which the goods originate.

Exemption

58. The Governor in Council may, by order, exempt goods from the condition set out in paragrapt 37(a) requiring proof of origin of goods or from the condition set out in paragraph 57(b) on such terms and conditions as may be specified therein.
