Notification by Japan
Addendum

The delegation of Japan has provided the following information on improvements and modifications to Japan's GSP scheme for the 1990 fiscal year, starting 1 April 1990.

## Reform of Japan's GSP Scheme

## 1. New beneficiary

Japan grants preferential treatment to Poland from 1 January 1990. Total number of beneficiaries is now 130 countries (thirty-eight eligible for special measures to least-developed countries) and twenty-five territories.

## 2. Announcement of ceiling quotas for fiscal year 1990

The ceiling quotas for fiscal year 1990 (effective from 1 April 1990 to 31 March 1991), which are listed in the Annex, are officially announced on 31 March 1990. The former product groups No. 32 (rubber tyres, etc. other than those used on motor vehicles), No. $10 \delta$ (silver) and No. 110 (non-alloy pig iron) are deleted from ceiling quotas list, because the effective duties of the products of these product groups are all reduced to duty free. The product group No. 56-2, which includes articles of wood of Kwarin, Tsuge or boxwood, Tagayasan (Cassia siamea), red sandalwood, rosewood or ebony wood, excluding ebony wood with white streaks, is newly established and administrated independently. For the product group No. 56-2, the flexible ceiling treatment and the flexible maximum country amount treatment are applied.
