Addendum

The following communication, dated 24 September 1990, has been received from the Permanent Delegation of Uruguay.

- Annex 3 List arranged by import tariff nomenclature resulting from the transposition of nomenclature, with the duty currently applied, the product number as in Annex II, the result of the ad valorem conversion of the tariffs originally negotiated, initial negotiator, average imports 87/89 from the initial negotiator, principal supplier and average imports 87/89 from the principal supplier;
- Annex 4 List of products to be withdrawn from the originally negotiated Schedule XXXI (these products are not included in Annex 1);

Annex 5 - List of tariff items that are modified in the proposed new Schedule XXXI with respect to the schedule originally negotiated; many of these changes increase the concessions originally negotiated or alter the level of binding upwards or downwards according to the product.
