UNITED STATES CARIBBEAN BASIN ECONOMIC RECOVERY ACT

Report of the Government of the United States
on the Trade-Related Provisions of the
Caribbean Basin Economic Recovery Act of 1983

Introduction

On 15 February 1985, the CONTRACTING PARTIES to the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT) decided, inter alia, to waive until 30 September 1995, the provisions of paragraph 1 of Article 1 of the General Agreement, "to the extent necessary to permit the Government of the United States to provide duty-free treatment to the eligible imports of Caribbean Basin countries benefiting from the provisions of the Caribbean Basin Economic Recovery Act, without being required to extend the same duty-free treatment to like products of any other contracting party".¹ In accordance with paragraph 7 of that Decision, the United States is providing its report to the GATT contracting parties on the United States Government's implementation of the trade-related provisions of the Caribbean Basin Economic Recovery Act of 1983 (CBERA), more commonly known as the Caribbean Basin Initiative (CBI). This report will cover events through October 1990 and data through calendar year 1989.

Duty-free treatment under the CBERA

Title II, section 211 of the CBERA allows the President of the United States to eliminate duties on all products, with certain exceptions, from those Caribbean countries that he designates as beneficiary countries. Presently, there are twenty three countries which are eligible to receive the benefits of the duty-free provisions of the CBERA. The following twenty countries were designated on 1 January 1984: Antigua and Barbuda, Barbados, Belize, British Virgin Islands, Costa Rica, Dominica, Dominican Republic, El Salvador, Grenada, Guatemala, Haiti, Honduras, Jamaica, Montserrat, Netherlands Antilles, Panama, St. Christopher-Nevis, St. Lucia, St. Vincent and the Grenadines, and Trinidad and Tobago. The Bahamas was designated a CBERA beneficiary country on 14 March 1985. On 11 April 1986, Aruba was designated a CBERA beneficiary retroactive to 1 January 1986, upon becoming independent of the Netherlands Antilles. Guyana was designated a CBERA beneficiary effective on 24 November 1988.

¹The exceptions from duty-free treatment have not changed since the enactment of CBERA. These are: textile and apparel articles which are subject to textile agreements; footwear, luggage, flat goods, work gloves, and leather wearing apparel not designated as eligible for purposes of our Generalized System of Preferences; prepared tuna; petroleum and petroleum products; watches and watch parts if such products contain any material from countries not accorded m.f.n. treatment.

Panama's beneficiary status under the CBERA was suspended on 9 April 1988, making it the first country to lose its designated status. Panama's benefits were restored effective 17 March 1990.

Caribbean Basin Economic Recovery Expansion Act

On 20 August 1990, President Bush signed the Caribbean Basin Economic Recovery Expansion Act of 1990 (CBEREA). The principal change to the CBERA was to delete the termination date of 30 September 1995. The CBI will remain a permanent program.

Other trade-related provisions enacted by the CBEREA include:

- ° a 20 per cent tariff reduction applied to certain leather products (handbags, luggage, flat goods, work gloves, and leather wearing apparel), which will be phased in over five years beginning in 1992 and will be limited to 2.5 per cent ad valorem; and
- ° duty-free imports from beneficiary countries for products made from 100 per cent U.S. components, except for textile articles, apparel articles, petroleum, and certain products derived from petroleum.

Administrative enhancement of the programme

In November 1989, President Bush asked his cabinet to determine ways to improve the CBI through administrative means within existing budget constraints. The initial package of measures was announced on 1 November 1990. These measures enhance the operation of the programme without directly expanding the trade-related provisions of the CBI. (See Annex 1 for "Fact Sheet" announcing the list of measures.)

United States trade with the CBERA countries

In the six full years during which the duty-free treatment provision of the CBI has been in effect (1984-89), total United States imports declined by approximately 23 per cent - from about \$8.6 billion to roughly \$6.6 billion. However, this drop was due to the fall in United States imports of petroleum from CBI beneficiaries - from \$5 billion in 1983 to about \$1 billion in 1989. Although just three beneficiary countries were directly affected by this change, the overall impact on the region's trade appears large.

Focusing on the total value of United States imports from the region overlooks some changes that are taking place in the composition of CBI beneficiary exports to the United States.

- ° The share of mineral products - consisting primarily of petroleum and petroleum products - has fallen substantially - from about half of United States imports from the region in 1983 to roughly 18 per cent in 1989.

- ° United States non-petroleum imports from the CBI grew annually by about 10 per cent from 1983 to 1989.
- ° Non-traditional CBI-eligible imports (i.e. other than products such as petroleum, coffee, sugar, bananas and bauxite) grew at an average annual rate of about 15 per cent.
- ° Textile/apparel imports from CBI beneficiaries have grown by an average annual rate of over 25 per cent since 1983.
- ° Together, non-traditional imports and textiles/apparel imports from CBI beneficiaries have grown on average by over 20 per cent per year over the 1983 to 1989 period.

Statistical annexes are provided to present a detailed description of the trade aspects of the CBI programme, focusing primarily on the period 1987-89. (GATT document L/6146, dated 3 April 1987, provided data for the years 1982-86). Annex 2 includes a list of the beneficiaries ranked according to the value of United States imports entered under the CBERA provisions. Annex 3 contains a list of the leading products, ranked by value, entered under the CBERA duty-free provisions in 1989. Annex 4 contains a table showing the United States trade balance with each of the CBERA beneficiaries and for all beneficiaries as a whole. Annex 5 contains data showing United States imports of the top thirty-five products from each beneficiary and from all of the beneficiaries combined.

ANNEX 1

IMPROVEMENTS IN THE OPERATION OF THE CARIBBEAN BASIN INITIATIVE

Fact Sheet

In November 1989, the President called on all relevant departments and agencies "to identify those actions which they can undertake, within existing budget constraints, to improve the operation of the Caribbean Basin Initiative". In response, an interagency task force sought ideas from representatives of the CBI Embassy Group; private sector organizations, and from our embassies in the region.

The proposals, listed below in the relevant categories, represent an initial package of measures. We remain open and encourage additional ways to improve the operation of the CBI. New CBI legislation, recently signed by President Bush, will allow us even more opportunities to enhance the CBI in the future.

Trade, investment and tourism

Proposals in this section are intended to increase directly investment and trade in the region. The region would benefit by helping the development of tourism, by improving the use of the programme, and by enhancing access to the United States market.

Several proposals in this section are designed to expand the use of existing sources of financing and to provide the region greater assurance of investment capital at below-market rates. The region should have greater assurance of receiving over \$100 million of investment funds. Investments resulting from this effort could be in products for export.

Also, using United States Government surveys and interagency analyses, countries in the region would generate additional information with which to further the region's trade and investment opportunities. If appropriate, we could explore with interested governments the negotiation of a bilateral investment treaty.

1. Publish in the Federal Register a proposed regulation to change the definition of distant ports.
2. Intensify efforts to improve investment in CBI countries.
3. Improve utilization rate of CBI tariff benefits.
4. Expedite the availability of investment funds in qualified CBI beneficiaries from Puerto Rico's use of Section 936.
5. Support tourism development.

Promotion, marketing and outreach

Proposals in this section are designed to expand investment and trade by promoting the region and products made in the region. Expanding private sector awareness of the Caribbean as an attractive place to invest and to purchase goods and services is critical to the success of the CBI programme.

6. Form CBI co-ordinating teams in region.
7. Strengthen commercial marketing assistance.
8. Strengthen and expand CBI promotion programme with United States companies and importers.
9. Provide NOAA fisheries assistance.
10. Renew United States private sector councils.
11. Enhance agribusiness marketing and investment assistance.
12. Engage senior Department of Commerce support for CBI programme.
13. Strengthen Department of Commerce Support in beneficiary countries.

Technical assistance

Proposals in this section will provide officials in the region information that will enable them to obtain a better understanding of specific segments of the United States market and to export to the United States market in a more efficient and less costly manner. This will enhance the reputation and perception of Caribbean Basin countries as reliable and timely suppliers, thereby expanding export earnings.

14. Provide environmental technical support.
15. Provide assistance on United States food import requirements.
16. Assist in training and improved procedures on pesticides.
17. Provide coastal management support.
18. Establish customs hot-line.
19. Encourage utilization of OAS Trade Promotion Data Bank.

Co-ordination

Implementation and enhancement of the CBI programme is an ongoing process requiring active and close co-ordination among agencies and feedback from officials in the region - both government and private sector. The proposal in this section is intended to improve this process to ensure that the CBI programme is operated in the most effective manner possible, thereby providing the intended benefits to the region.

20. Improve Department of Commerce and United States AID interagency implementation co-ordination of the CBI programme.
