Uganda covers a total of some $216,242.88$ squere kilometres; of this 15,719.83 squarc kilometres or 7.2 per cent is under open water, 7,636.9 sq. km: or 3.6 per cent is permenent swaip, $16,107.85 \mathrm{sq}$. km. or 8.3 per cent is forest reserve, $14,630 \mathrm{sq}$. kn. or 7.5 per cent is game reserves, 521 sq . km. or 0.27 per sent is urben areas and 34,972 sq. kw. or 17.5 per cent is land under agricultural use. The land still availeble for agricultural development and other purposes amounts to some $105,113.76$ sq. kn. or 53.9 per cent. The above quoted figure clearly indicates that there is still vest land availeble for intensification of agricultural production. However, this figure tends to vary as a good portion of it may be covered with forest which requires to be cleared before it is utilized.
