## Inventory of Variable Levies and Other Special Charges on Imports

- 1. The addenda to the present document contain information on variable levies and other special charges on imports, submitted by delegations in accordance with the agreement reached in the Group at its meeting of 25 to 27 February 1974 (document MTN/3E/2, paragraph 9).
- 2. Information received up to 20 June 1974 is being issued in the following addenda:
  - Add.1 European Communities
  - Add.2 Finland
  - Add.3 Hungary
  - Add.4 Sweden
  - Add.5 Switzerland
  - Add.6 Yugoslavia
- 3. The delegations of Brazil, Bulgaria, Canada and Norway have stated that no measures of this kind are applied in their countries.
- 4. Information arriving at a later date will be issued in further addenda to the present document.
- 5. This document is designed to furnish the fullest possible inventory of variable levies and other special charges applied by various countries or groups of countries on their imports. A number of countries have notified that their exports are affected by such measures; some of these notifications, made earlier in another GATT body, may be found in section E of document MTN/3B/5. These various notifications, some of which refer to a few specific products while others refer to the system as a whole, have not been reproduced separately in the present document.
- 6. This document and its addenda constitute an updating of the inventory of variable levies and other special charges published in document COM.AG/W/68/Add.3 and the partial revision thereof (document COM.AG/W/84 and addenda), which furnished information concerning the following countries: Austria, European Communities (six countries), Denmark, Finland, Greece, United Kingdom, Spain, Sweden and Switzerland.
