#### SENEGAL

As the Republic of Senegal is a member of the group of Associated African and Malagasy States (AAMS) linked to the European Economic Community (EEC), its imports are regulated by the rules governing trade between States members of the AAMS on the one hand, and between the AAMS and the EEC on the other.

Products originating in the EEC and the AAMS are therefore admitted to Senegal:

- free of duty or equivalent charges;
- the same treatment is applied to all such products, without preference or quantitative restrictions.

(See Yaoundé Convention II, Chapter I, Articles 3, 4, 5 and 7.)

Wheat, however, is subject to an import quota.

There is no quota for the other cereals - rice, millet, and sorghum.

In 1963, the monopoly for the importation of rice was given to a State organization, the Senegal Agricultural Marketing Bureau (OCAS).
