  - BQ: Bilateral quota.

South Africa: In order to maintain a reasonable degree of price stability in the agricultural sector in South Africa, bearing in mind the important rê e played by this sector and the variable climatic conditions which prevail in South Africa, it is incumbent on statutory marketing boards and the Government to take measures with a view to:

- (a) avoiding, as far as possible, excessive fluctuations in supplies; and
- (b) ensuring continuity of supplies and an equitable distribution of available quantities.

Unrestrained imports may at times largely negate efforts in this regard. It is accordingly necessary to exercise a measure of control over imports. The various marketing boards are generally best suited to ascertain the actual supply position obtaining in respect of the commodities concerned.

It is also incumbent on them to gauge the supply position and to make recommendations regarding the necessity or otherwise for local supplies to be adjusted through exports or imports in order to ensure that adequate supplies are continuously available in all parts of the country.
