RESPONSES TO REQUESTS FOR ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

The attached communication received from the delegation of <u>Hong Kong</u> in response to the requests for additional trade information addressed by the United States (MTN.GNG/NG6/TI/1) is circulated to the members of the Group.

Hong Kong's Response to United States Request for Information Dated 30 March 1988

- 1. Rice is a staple food in Hong Kong. Importation of rice for local consumption is subject to a control scheme to ensure regular and adequate supply at stable prices and to provide a reserve stock for emergency purposes. The scheme stipulates the level of quarterly import quota which is calculated on the basis of demand and consumption pattern in the previous quarter.
- 2. Under the scheme only registered importers may import rice. To be eligible for registration, the importer has to meet certain requirements, e.g. demonstrated past import ability; established connections with overseas suppliers; sufficient financial resources to hold stock etc. These requirements are maintained to ensure that the importer has the capability and resources to deal with rice trading and stock-keeping. Import licences for registered importers are granted automatically. There is no restriction on the sourcing of rice supply.
- 3. In 1987, 345,600 tonnes of rice were imported for local consumption.
