REFERENCE LIST OF SECTORS

Note by the Secretariat

In the section relating to future work, Part II of the Montreal Ministerial Declaration (MTN.TNC/7(MIN)) provides for the compilation by the Secretariat of a reference list of sectors by 20 April 1989. It is noted that this process could be assisted by submissions of participants in the Group of Negotiations on Services.

This note presents one possible reference list and discusses a number of matters related to its determination.

- 1. There is a variety of sectoral classification systems that could be used as a basis for delineating the a reference list of sectors of the Secretariat requested in Part II of the Montreal Ministerial Declaration (MTN.TNC/7(MIN)). Both existing and planned statistical classification systems answer to three broad characterizations, depending on whether their respective focus is on activities, products or international transactions. The International Standard Industrial Classification (ISIC) and the System of National Accounts (SNA) are examples of the first type; the planned Central Product Classification (CPC) is an example of the second type; and the IMF Balance of Payments (BOP) typifies the third category.
- The ISIC is the most commonly used and best-known activity-based 2. classification system (see Appendix III for a list of its major components). It does not make a formal distinction between goods and services, neither of which are defined or classified separately. Activities classified in the ISIC represent types of production that observation (statistical) units engage in. The unit can be real (i.e. observable) or fictive (i.e. a construction created by a statistician). In the ISIC, an industry is defined as the summation of all units primarily engaged in the same or similar kind of activity. Activity-based classifications suffer from two main shortcomings from the point of view of the proposed reference list. First, in terms of statistical coverage, an activity-based classification is incomplete. The units classified under a given category of the ISIC may include services which are not characteristic of the principal kind of economic activity of the producing unit. Recorded activities, therefore, may not correspond one to one with the actual production of services. A second problem derives from the fact that it is ultimately service outputs and not the activities that generate them - which enter international trade
- 3. Product-based classifications, such as the CPC, are closely related to activity classifications inasmuch as products are typically the outputs of specific kinds of activities. Product-based classifications, however, provide a greater degree of disaggregation than activity-based systems as there are more identifiable products than activities. Thus, the CPC distinguishes almost 600 service products, as opposed to the ISIC's 130 service activities. The CPC is based on transactions between units and is thus similar to the ISIC in that it does not capture intra-unit transactions. A distinction is made between goods, services and intangible assets (both financial and non-financial), but all are considered to be products. As with the ISIC, no distinct definition of goods and services is provided in the CPC (see Appendix III for a list of its components). The CPC focuses on products that are transacted (i.e. sold commercially), as opposed to producers or kinds of activities.

- 4. The conceptual difference between activity- and product-based classifications can perhaps be illustrated as follows. In the ISIC, the output of a manufacturer of a certain product that also provides transportation, maintenance and repair services will be allocated to the sector that constitutes its primary sphere of activity i.e. the manufacture of the particular product. The CPC, in contrast, will provide separate estimates of the value of all three components, providing a more accurate and detailed picture of the actual value of production.
- 5. Transaction-based classifications (see Appendix III) are typically framed with a view to monitoring developments in the balance of payments (BOP) of a given country. Their chief focus is on cross-border transactions involving flows of foreign exchange. Unlike activity- or product-based systems, transaction-based classifications are not designed to capture fully the universe of commercially-provided services.
- The proposed reference list is based on a product classification for the following reasons. First, international transactions do not pertain to activities, as these are primarily statistical constructions. Second, the provision of a service may require a producer (supplier) to move to the location of the consumer (recipient). While a product-based system does not specifically include factor flows (e.g. movement of labour and capital) these are covered to the extent that they actually produce a service product. Services that require factor movement to be provided internationally have thus been included in the proposed reference list, as appears necessary at this stage from paragraph 4 of the Montreal Ministerial Declaration. Utilisation of a product-based system will also allow foreign provision to be related to domestic production. Furthermore, a focus on products allows a higher degree of disaggregation and precision to be attained should it become necessary, at a later stage, when examining the nature of transactions (e.g. specificity of purpose) or the sectoral implications of various concepts. Finally, a product-based system meets the objective of achieving the highest degree of concordance with existing and proposed systems for recording statistics on services trade and production.
- 7. The proposed reference list (see below) constitutes an aggregated version of the CPC (see Appendix II for a concordance between the reference list, the CPC, and the ISIC Rev.3). Services which, broadly speaking, may be seen as neither tradeable nor commercially provided have been excluded. Sales of intangible assets, such as franchising or licensing, have been included. It should also be noted that the tourism sector does not appear in the proposed reference list. Tourism can be seen as consisting of a large number of components (hotels, restaurants, transportation, etc.) which will already be registered elsewhere in the list. This does not, however, imply that tourism should not be included. Appendix I contains a non-exhaustive list of the likely components of a tourism sector, as its inclusion would necessitate the delineation of the components of the tourism sector.
