Introduction

1. At the meeting of the Negotiating Group on Tropical Products held on 21 April 1989, it was agreed that at its meetings in June and July 1989 the Negotiating Group should carry out a multilateral review of the tariff and non-tariff situation in the light of the results achieved at Montreal with a view to identifying remaining barriers and taking stock of the present situation in pursuance of the negotiating objective of the fullest liberalization of trade in tropical products including in their processed and semi-processed forms. For the purpose of this multilateral review this document updates and recasts the previously circulated Guide for multilateral consultations regarding this product group, taking into account contributions so far made on tropical products and other developments in the negotiations.

2. Table 1 "country notes" provides information on certain elements of the contributions made by individual countries/markets on tropical products at the Mid-Term Review in Montreal as contained in document MTN.GNG/17 and Add.1, such as implementation dates, binding and the nature of contributions. With regard to these results, it is stated in document MTN.GNG/17, paragraph 2 as follows:

"These contributions are made under the following terms and conditions:

- (a) participants undertake to apply the measures indicated by them on a provisional basis, for the duration of the round, it being understood that if any participant finds it necessary to withdraw any or all of its contributions other participants may wish to re-assess their own contributions;
- (b) in relation to m.f.n. contributions, individual participants undertake to consider binding concessions at the end of the Round in the light of the overall results achieved."

Explanation of tables

3. This documents provides tariff and NTM data, as well as information on major suppliers and requesting countries according to product sub-groups. The explanation of tables containing tariff and NTM data, which are common for all product sub-groups are given below.

- For respective product sub-groups, table (a) series (e.g. Table 2(a)) show the tariff situation (MFN and GSP) of eleven developed country markets obtained or obtainable with the implementation of their contributions. Underlined tariff rates are the result of pre-Montreal negotiations on tropical products. Most of their contributions will be implemented by mid-1989; any contributions whose implementation is either staged or delayed are indicated in notes to these tables.
- For respective product sub-groups table (b) series (e.g. Table 2(b)) cover the eighteen countries/markets which participated in the negotiated package recorded in documents MTN.GNG/17 and Add.1. including eleven developed country markets and seven other countries/markets. These tables show both previous tariff rates and new tariff rates resulting from negotiations in juxtaposition, so that the depth of tariff cuts would be evident. These tables also include indications of progress made in the area of non-tariff measures. See next page for the explanation of symbols used in table (b) series.
- For respective product sub-groups, table (c) series (e.g. Table 2(c))) cover six other countries which have made autonomous unilateral contributions either on an m.f.n. basis (Indonesia¹, Republic of Korea and South Africa²) or under the GSP (Czechoslovakia, Hungary and Poland) and show both previous and new tariff rates (MFN and/or GSP).

4. The tariff and NTM data for certain participants are being compiled on the basis of "additional information" provided under the procedures for negotiations on tropical products adopted on 29 January 1988 (NG6/TI/-series). These data will be circulated as addenda to this document as soon as they are ready.

I. Natural Rubber

A. The Tariff and NM situation and the results of pre-Montreal negotiations

5. An overview of the tariff situation affecting natural rubber taking into account the results of pre-Montreal negotiations is given below for the markets covered by Table 2(a). See page 5 for the explanation of Tables 2(a), 2(b) and 2(c) in this section.

6. As a result of past rounds of multilateral trade negotiations and the negotiations so far carried out in the Uruguay Round, the eleven developed-country markets have granted natural rubber duty-free treatment on an MFN basis with the exception of the following:

II. Rubber Products

A. The Tariff and NTM situation and the results of pre-Montreal negotiations

(a) Tariffs

7. An overview of the tariff situation affecting rubber products taking into account the results of pre-Montreal negotiations is given below for the markets covered by Table 3(a). See page 5 for the explanation of Tables 3(a), 3(b) and 3(c) in this section.

8. Nordic countries (Finland, Norway and Sweden) and Switzerland provide developing countries MFN duty-free treatment or unlimited GSP duty-free treatment for all dutiable items in Chapter 40 with the exception that Finland excludes most rubber tyres and tubes from GSP and does not apply GSP on certain rubber products from Hong Kong. The United States also grants such treatment with some exceptions (HS Nos. 4008.21, 4011.50, 4013.20, ex 4015.19, 4015.90 and 4016.95).

9. In Canada sheets and strip and most other rubber products are subject to MFN duties of 10.2 per cent to 11.7 per cent or GSP rates of 6.5 per cent to 7.5 per cent except that certain tyres and tubes have been granted MFN duty-free treatment. Rubber gloves and apparel are subject to MFN duties of 22.5 per cent to 25 per cent or GSP rates of 15 per cent to 16.5 per cent.

10. Japan has granted all items in Chapter 40 MFN or GSP duty-free treatment. While its GSP treatment is subject to monthly-controlled ceiling limitations and maximum country amounts, these limitations are flexibly administered. In other words, imports under GSP are allowed to continue after quantitative limitations have been reached unless a particular decision is taken not to apply GSP any longer. With respect to tyres and tubes for other than motor cars, however, the maximum country amount is not flexibly administered.

11. The EEC has also granted developing countries MFN or GSP duty-free treatment. All items in Chapter 40 except rubber tyres and tubes have been granted unlimited GSP duty-free treatment as non-sensitive items. With respect to rubber tyres and tubes, GSP is not applicable to Romania and GSP imports from other GSP beneficiaries are subject to country-by-country ceiling limitations. The Republic of Korea is no longer a beneficiary of the EEC GSP scheme since 1988.

12. In Austria duty rates on tyres and tubes remain at MFN 20 per cent and GSP 10 per cent. All other rubber products are generally dutiable at MFN 5 per cent to 9 per cent. As a result of pre-Montreal negotiations on tropical products, Austria has reduced GSP rates on these rubber products from one half of corresponding MFN rates to one quarter, i.e. 1.2 per cent to 2.2 per cent.

13. Australia is reducing in stages its MFN and GSP rates on most rubber products to 15 per cent and 10 per cent, respectively. These new rates will enter into force on 1 July 1992. Rubber gloves remain subject to the MFN rate of 25 per cent and the GSP rate of 20 per cent, and rubber garments, the MFN rate of 60 per cent and the GSP rate of 55 per cent.

14. In New Zealand imports of rubber products from developing countries largely remain dutiable at the level of up to 45 per cent MFN and up to 35 per cent GSP although this country has eliminated its duties on inner tubes and non-automobile tyres.

(b) Non-tariff measures

15. Most quantitative restrictions still remaining in developed countries concern rubber tyres and tubes. Amongst EEC members, Spain restricts imports of rubber tyres and inner tubes. Greece restricts imports of tyre cases, tyre flaps and tubeless tyres and Ireland restricts imports of used tyre cases and tubeless tyres for bicycles. Italy and Portugal restrict imports of rubber tyres from Japan. Portugal maintains quantitative import restrictions on such rubber products as rubber plates and sheets, rubber tubing, rubber apparel and miscellaneous rubber articles. However, those restrictions will be removed on 31 December 1992 as provided for in the accession agreement of the country with the EEC.

16. Norway restricts imports of new pneumatic tyres for passenger cars from Japan and the Republic of Korea. Japan restricts imports of rubber adhesives containing more than 5 per cent of benzine by volume of solvent (HS ex 4005, 4016) in accordance with the requirements of the Industrial Safety and Health Law.

17. In New Zealand a number of rubber products are subject to import licensing controls. Licensing controls under the General Rubber Goods Industry Plan are due to be phased out on 1 January 1990, but this date may be brought forward in the review of the Plan. Licensing controls under the Tyre Industry Plan were phased out on 1 April 1989. Licensing controls under the Motor Vehicle Industry Development Plan were removed on 1 January 1989 (see MTN.GNG/NG6/LT/32 for details).

III. Tropical Wood

A. The tariff and NTM situation and the results of pre-Montreal negotiations

18. An overview of the tariff situation, taking into account the results of pre-Montreal negotiations is given below for the markets covered by Table 4(a). See page 5 for the explanation of Tables 4(a), 4(b) and 4(c) in this section.

19. As a result of past rounds of multilateral trade negotiations and the negotiations on tropical products so far carried out in the Uruguay Round, all the eleven developed-country markets have granted tropical wood in the rough and roughly squared (ex 4403) MFN duty-free treatment (bound or binding undertaken) except that Switzerland grants two items (4403.10 and .99) GSP duty-free treatment while maintaining MFN duties on these items.

20. With respect to tropical wood, sawn or chipped lengthwise, sliced or peeled (ex 4407), the United States, Canada, Finland, Norway and Sweden have granted MFN duty-free treatment, and the EEC and Switzerland, GSP duty-free treatment. In Japan, Austria, Australia and New Zealand certain tropical wood is still partly MFN/GSP dutiable for developing countries, as indicated below:

IV. Wood Products

A. The Tariff and NTM situation and the results of pre-Montreal negotiations

(a) Tariffs

22. An overview of the tariff situation taking into account the results of pre-Montreal negotiations is given below for the markets covered by Table 5(a). See page 5 for the explanation of Tables 5(a), 5(b) and 5(c) in this section.

23. Nordic countries (Finland, Norway, and Sweden) and Switzerland have provided developing countries MFN duty-free treatment or unlimited GSP duty-free treatment for all items in HS Chapters 44 and 94.

24. The United States has also granted such treatment with some exceptions (plywood, not tongued, grooved or rabbeted; certain miscellaneous wood articles). Canada has granted veneer sheets MFN duty-free treatment but most other wood products are subject to MFN duties of 4 per cent to 15 per cent. The Canadian GSP scheme covers all of these wood products at the rates of 0 per cent to 10.5 per cent.

25. With respect to all items in Chapters 44 and 94 Japan provides developing countries MFN or GSP duty-free treatment, with the exception that plywood is dutiable on an MFN basis and that the GSP rate on sheets for plywood are still positive at 2.5 per cent after having been reduced. Japan's GSP on wood products are subject to different types of ceiling limitations and maximum country amounts.

26. The EEC also provides developing countries MFN or GSP duty-free treatment. However, GSP imports of some sensitive items are subject to quota/ceiling limitations. Romania is excluded from the application of GSP on certain wood items. The Republic of Korea is no longer a beneficiary of the EEC GSP scheme since 1988.

27. In Austria wood products are subject to MFN duties of 6 per cent to 18 per cent and wood furniture, MFN duties of 7 per cent to 27 per cent. All wood products have been covered by GSP. GSP rates are one-half of corresponding MFN rates. In June 1989 the Austrian parliament did not approve the reduction of GSP rates proposed by the Government on veneer sheets and plywood of tropical wood (4408.20 and 4412.11) expressing serious concern for the global environmental situation partly caused by deforestation (cf. MTN.GNG/17/Corr.5).

28. In Australia veneer sheets have been granted GSP duty-free treatment. MFN duties on other wood products are being reduced to 10 per cent or 15 per cent in stages. The Australian GSP scheme covers all of these wood products. GSP rates of Australia are uniformly 5 percentage points less than corresponding MFN rates. If MFN rates are reduced, GSP rates will be automatically reduced.

29. In New Zealand MFN duties on most wood products are being reduced to 7.5-17 per cent. The New Zealand GSP scheme covers all wood products at 0 per cent to 13.5 per cent.

(b) Non-tariff measures

30. The eleven developed-country markets no longer maintain any import restrictions on wood products, apart from quotas maintained by Denmark (EEC) on imports of wooden seats and wood furniture from the Republic of Korea. In recent years New Zealand has eliminated quantitative restrictions on a wide range of wood products (cf. MTN.GNG/NG6/LT/32 and MTN.GNG/NG6/W/15/Add.2).
