Tourism. Business Conventions	Bilateral Agreement for the granting of tax deductions to individuals attending business conventions in the territories of the parties.	United States of America	Indefinite	Individuals attending business conventions receive a preferential deduction for expenses incurred in the territory of the parties.
Audiovisual Services	Bilateral Agreement to grant national treatment to audiovisual works originating in the countries indicated in Column (3).	European Economic Community	Indefinite

All countries	Indefinite	Mandatory legislation providing that Mexican shipping companies compete on an equal footing in international transport.
Maritime Transport (freight)	Access to all public and private cargoes by Bilateral Agreement	Chile	Indefinite	Economic Complementarity Agreement between Mexico and Chile
