This tax is not imposed on revenue generated by foreign vessels provided that, in their countries of registration, there is no similar tax or equivalent or similar exemptions are granted to Chilean shipping enterprises. If a vessel is operated by or belongs to a shipping enterprise domiciled in a country that is not the country of registration, the requirement of reciprocity applies to each country.</p>	All	Indefinite	Need to ensure market access
