Statement by H.E. Mr. B.K. Zutshi, Ambassador, Permanent Representative

The Uruguay Round was an enterprise of great magnitude which we are bringing to a successful conclusion today. The new multilateral trading system, when it comes into effect, will have an impact on the international community in many ways which we may not be able to anticipate now.

As you rightly mentioned, Mr. Chairman, this is an historic moment at the end of a long and tortuous process, often frustrating, but also intellectually stimulating and professionally fulfilling. I consider it a great privilege to have been associated with this enterprise.

As many other speakers have pointed out, we would have liked the results in some areas to have been different and in others, better. But all the same, we welcome the overall outcome and will join with others in accepting and adopting the results.

Your innate sense of fairness, relentless drive and unfailing intellectual integrity undoubtedly paved the way for this successful outcome.
